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Annual Play Area Inspection Report

Woodchurch Parish Council Playground Inspection Report Summary of work required September 2013

The Play Inspection Company inspected the playground equipment on 16 July 2013.

Items from the inspection report marked with action points are included in the list below.

- 1. Vegetation overhanging one bench cut back.
- 2. Provide signs with emergency contact details decided at PC meeting on 27 September not to do this.
- 3. Wet pour surfaces gaps opening between the surfacing and the edging surround or between the joints in the surface monitor for any further deterioration and repair as required.
- 4. Wet pour surfaces trip hazards at the edges of the impact absorbing surface reinstate surrounding surface levels to remove the trip points.
- 5. The wet pour surface is crumbling monitor for any further deterioration and repair as required
- 6. Swings older children seats are perishing monitor for any further deterioration and replace as required.
- 7. Swings older children bushes are worn or missing replace worn or missing bushes
- 8. Swings younger children chain openings are in excess of the 8.6mm recommended by BS EN 1176 monitor use and replace with compliant chains during next maintenance cycle.
- 9. Swings younger children one of the seat frames is damaged replace the seat
- 10. Swings younger children some chain wear monitor for any further deterioration and replace when 40% worn.
- 11. Spring Motorbike handgrips/footrests rotate and may cause an unexpected movement for the user **secure to prevent rotation.**
- 12. Spring Motorbike base plate bolts form a hard object within the falling space of the equipment in contravention of the requirements of BS EN 1176 Part 1 Cover over the bolts
- 13. Spring See-Saw handgrips/footrests rotate and may cause an unexpected movement for the user secure to prevent rotation.
- 14. Adult exercise community equipment area around the sign has eroded creating a trip point reinstate.
- 15. From Village Risk Assessment not PIC assessment Sign has suffered water damage

EMAIL CORRESPONDENCE

Police Report received from PCSO Gary Carr.

As of the time of writing, there has been no reported crime or ASB in the ward this month. There has been several reports of farm animals loose on the roads and with all the agricultural machinery using rural roads during the harvest please be mindful of your speed.

KCC warden Chris Banyard and I have attended the coffee afternoon at the scout hut and spoke to locals about any local issues. Kent Police have also patrolled outside Woodchurch Primary

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School after issues with parking. I would remind parents dropping off and picking up their children to respect the zig zag lines outside the school and also where they park which can obstruct nearby roads. Kent Police and Ashford Council traffic wardens will be monitoring the situation. There have been several cars broken into or stolen in the rural wards and I would ask owners to make sure that their cars are locked and any valuables removed from view when not being used.

PCSO Carr updated his report by informing councillors that there had been a theft from A local property and items were stolen from a car that was left in a ditch overnight following an accident.

12. HIGHWAY ISSUES

KHS has installed a grit bin on the triangle at the junction of The Green and Lower Road. Councillors would prefer it to be sited on the verge on Lower Road and will see if it can be moved.

Councillors unanimously agreed not to request a bag of salt from KHS.

13. FORUM FOR EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION BETWEEN COUNCILLORS

The official opening of the Woodchurch Community Information Exchange is to take place on 28 September at noon.

Mr West reported that there will be Carol Singing on The Green with the Church, the school and local residents. The music will be provided by Cranbrook Brass Band. The event will be a fund raising event for the Salvation Army's Christmas Appeal.
