Woodchurch Parish Council to canvas residents on proposal to build 50 houses on Front Road

Woodchurch Parish Council is asking villagers to comment on proposals to build fifty houses on land off Front Road, opposite Kirkwood Avenue. Part of this land is already identified for development in the 2030 Ashford Plan. The new proposal seeks to extend beyond this onto adjacent agricultural land.

The proposal, by Cheshire-based Gladman Land, has been made following plans by another developer to build ten houses on the part of the site already designated for development. Links to more details about the current proposal can be found at www.woodchurchhub.uk/front-road-proposed-development/

Until Gladman has formally submitted plans it is not possible to meaningfully consider the proposal, but the Parish Council is asking Woodchurch residents for their views. They can comment on what types of housing the village needs, the number of houses they consider appropriate for the site and also their reasons for supporting or objecting to the proposal. The results of the Parish Council survey will inform all future discussions with Ashford Brough Council, should the planning application go forward.

Gladman itself has already sent out a mail shot to some villagers and has set up a web portal requesting specific input on its proposals, so has a narrower remit. We would instead urge village residents to complete the Parish Council feedback form as this will better help understand the wider views from within the village. The Parish Council also wants to ensure that residents who don't have Internet access can also make their views known and so a printed copy of the feedback form has been included with this newsletter. It is important that the views of the whole village are considered. Whether in favour, undecided, or against this type of development, this is an opportunity for residents to make their voices heard.

News from Woodchurch Surgery

The NHS have announced the following changes

- Ending of the Minor Injuries Service at Woodchurch Surgery
- Ending of the Rural weekend service (held at Tenterden and Hamstreet Surgeries)
- Establishment of the Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC) at the William Harvey Hospital

Following a change in national policy, the minor injury service and the rural weekend service (held at Tenterden and Hamstreet surgeries) have been stopped by the CCG as of 31st October 2020.

A new Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC) will start on 1st November at William Harvey Hospital and has been set up to deal with minor illnesses and minor injuries which would normally have been dealt with at this surgery. It will be open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, including bank holidays.

The UTC is located at the William Harvey Hospital and it is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

From 1st November appointments for the following minor illnesses and minor injuries will be dealt with at the UTC and appointments should be booked by calling 111

The service will deal with:

Strains and sprains Skin infections and rashes Eye problems Coughs and colds Feverish illness in children Abdominal pain Vomiting and diarrhoea Emergency contraception Suspected broken limbs Minor head injuries Cuts and grazes Bites and stings Minor scalds and burns Ear and throat infections

Woodchurch Winter Wonderland Walk

Firstly, we would like to announce that Woodchurch Gardening Society has been incorporated into Woodchurch in Bloom. Due to all the restrictions this year, sadly it has meant that Woodchurch Gardening Society (WGS) is no longer able to stand alone as a group. The WGS claims to be the oldest society in the village, founded in 1887. It originated as the Woodchurch Amateurs and the Cottage Gardening Society which existed under the patronage of the Schreiber family, owners of the estate that covered much of the village.

As a result of the above, Woodchurch in Bloom are delighted to incorporate WGS into our group and warmly welcome all new members!

HOPE - our permanent village pebble butterfly

Latest update - we are now excited to confirm that the frame for HOPE is being built during early November. All the pebbles will then be fixed in place, ready for everyone to enjoy seeing our beautiful village butterfly by the entrance to the

Memorial Hall, hopefully by December. Watch this space.....!

We are delighted to let you know of a winter initiative we are organising that we hope will help to spread some 'Woodchurch in Bloom' cheer across what we know will be a few tricky winter months. By the end of November, we will have a map trail ready that will highlight a walk/drive route around the village and taking in all our Village planters & planted areas. We



are currently increasing the number of planters around the village and delighted that over 30 villagers have now volunteered to 'adopt' a planter to make them as colourful and creative through the winter months.

We will share the trail map as soon as it is ready online and via other communication channels as well as hopefully in the December newsletter too. In the meantime, keep a look out for new planters appearing and also for replanting of all planters taking place!

Proposed development by Gladman on land off Front Road

We would instead urge village residents to complete the feedback form below as this will better help the Parish Council to understand the wider views from within the village. This will also enable them to respond quickly and appropriately once any planning applications have been submitted. When completed, please fold and seal and return to Woodchurch HUB by November 16th

When completing your feedback you may want to consider the following:

* The proposed development would only partially be on land that has been identified for village development. A much greater proportion of the proposed development area would be on land currently designated as agricultural.

* The village school currently takes the majority of its students from outside of the village but they are still low on pupil numbers. They have confirmed that they do require more children to enrol at the school in the future.

* The additional housing will result in an increase in the number of cars driving through the village. Road access to/from the proposed development could be an issue with the increased number of cars, though the safety of any access would have had to be approved by Kent Highways during the consideration of any initial planning application.

* The Surgery has recently been extended to include two additional consulting rooms to expand their capacity. This is in preparation for potentially supporting future additional patients from Chilmington Green.

* The building work would result in significant construction traffic passing through the village until the development has been completed. This could result in disruption in an already busy part of the village.

* Southern Water have confirmed that they would be responsible for ensuring that there was sufficient capacity to deal with any additional ground and waste water resulting from this, or any future, development.

* Most developers are likely to want to build as many luxury 5-6 bedroom houses as they can. The village residents need to let any potential future developer know the types of housing that the village feels it needs.
