News From The Parish Council

We have co-opted three new councillors this month and wish to welcome Ciaran Molloy, Nicola Job and Eleanor Jones on board. They attended the meeting held on 26th November so this means we have a full complement of councillors once again.

We are also delighted that the work on the Green play area has been completed. This was refurbished through the Parish Council budget and a grant from KCC, and it is great to see the play area looking fresh and new again. Thanks for everybody's patience while this has been ongoing- the weather had posed some challenges to the schedule.

The Parish Council has completed its survey of the village views on the proposed Gladman development on Front Road. Thanks to everyone who took the time to offer feedback, your views are really valued and the more feedback we have the more we are able to represent the wishes of the community. As the Parish Council receives more information we will share this with the village and gather further feedback. It is important to remember that there has been no formal planning proposal submitted to Ashford Borough Council at this time. Should you wish to feedback further views regarding this then you are always welcome to do so. The feedback form is still available on the community Web site www.woodchurchhub.uk/front-road-proposed-development or you can post your feedback at The HUB.

The Parish Council are also concerned about an increase in parking problems with vehicles being left mounted up on curbs and also unauthorised parking on parts of the Green - we are aware in some areas of the village parking on the road can cause an issue, but please remember to be considerate to others. Wheelchair users and buggies will not be able to pass cars which are blocking half the pavement, and the Green should not be parked on without permission. This is particularly a problem at this time of year as it will damage the grass and erode the edge of the Green.

2020 has been a financially challenging year, and the Parish Council is likely to see its budget reduce by approximately 10% for the forthcoming year. This is due to the possible withdrawal by Ashford Borough Council of two discretionary grants, the Concurrent Functions Grant and Council Tax Support Grant. The Parish Council has decided not to increase the precept charge but to make good the shortfall in funding. Councillors felt it would be fairer to meet any shortfall from the reserves and or savings made in this round of budget setting. This will prevent any increase being passed onto the community.

With Christmas fast approaching, our final news is that there will be a large Christmas Tree on the Green, organised by the Woodchurch in Bloom team and funded by the Parish Council and the generosity of local businesses. We are now running a campaign to fund the lights to go on this tree. Lights of this size and number are costly, but they will be substantial and fit for purpose and will light the Green at this special time of year for years to come. This is an investment in the Village which all will benefit from and if you are able to support this campaign or share details of any organisations that might help then please get in touch. We would like to thank Woodchurch in Bloom for their support of this project so far and indeed their work for the Woodchurch Winter Wonderland Walk.

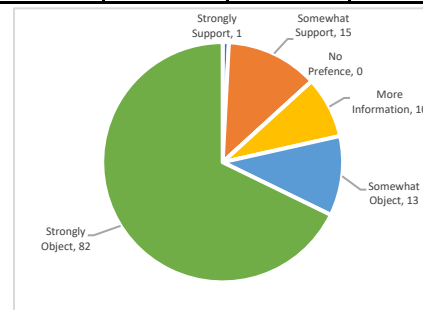

The feedback forms were delivered to over **800 homes** in the Woodchurch area, through the monthly HUB Newsletter. From this a **total of 122 feedback forms were returned** by the deadline.

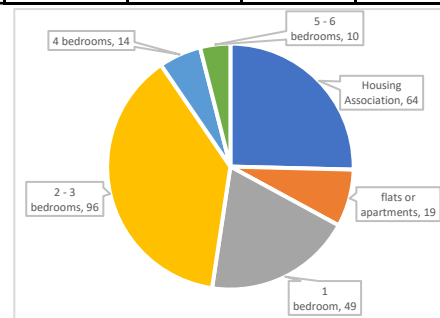
The first question was to gauge **residents' views** about the concept that has been put forward by Gladman.

To enable **residents to share the specific points** in their own words, they were asked to give feedback as free text comments. When analysing these comments, it was possible to group the points into discrete common themes. Please note that these are opinions and more work will need to be done to confirm their accuracy. The number in brackets is the number of times this point was raised.

- (42) It would erode the village atmosphere and increase urbanisation
- (32) It would create too much additional traffic
- (27) This is too large a development for this site.
- (24) More housing is required for younger generation families in the village that is affordable
- (21) This is too large a development for the village.
- (19) Building should not be permitted on agricultural land
- (17) There would be dangerous access from the development onto Front Road
- (17) Sewage and drainage - there is insufficient capacity
- (14) It would increase the traffic Congestion/danger on the Front Road bend
- (13) There is insufficient "local infrastructure" - general
- (12) There is already sufficient executive style housing in the village
- (12) Doctors surgery - There is insufficient capacity
- (10) This development falls outside of the Ashford Local Plan
- (10) There are already very many new houses being built at Chilmington Green, which is very close. Ashford is encroaching upon the villages.
- (10) There is distrust of the developers
- (8) School - there is insufficient capacity
- (8) It could benefit and increase the number of local businesses and shops
- (6) No reason given
- (6) Additional housing in the village is unnecessary
- (6) It would affect the local environment and local wildlife
- (4) School - The school needs more pupils and so would benefit
- (4) There is insufficient information so far
- (4) Infill development sites are available elsewhere
- (4) This would set a precedent for future developments

Dear Friends,

Advent is almost upon us, in this difficult year. We hope and pray that everyone is keeping well and coping OK with the latest period of isolation.

One of our biggest challenges has been to plan services and activities which enable us to engage with our village communities at this special time, but knowing that we can't use our church buildings in the way that we normally do. We are extremely grateful that so many people have come together to offer a wide range of things to take part in or watch or visit.

Online, we will have an Open Church nativity service; a video showing how to make a Christingle and a Christingle service (which will be used by our schools as well as being available to families at home); a Bereavement Service including the reading of the names of family members who have died, and a tree in church where you can add the name of anyone you miss at this time; several live-streamed and recorded services of Eucharist and a BCP Evensong; and "Listening to God" - interactive sessions led by Reverend Mike. We have also organised activity packs for children involving Christmas arts and crafts, a Christingle pack to do at home (for children at other schools), and a floodlit nativity scene at All Saints.



We would also like to recommend Advent Online, which is a new resource put together by some of the clergy I studied with <https://adventonline.faith/advent-calendar> - there is a lovely mix of scripture, reflections, images and music for each day of advent. A great resource to dip into when you have time.

Advent is a time when we reflect on the coming of Christ. The light of Christ coming into the darkness of our world. This year, it is more important than ever that we look for the light and hold on to the hope of all that is to come. Perhaps the light for us will come with the winter sun on a fine day, the chance to walk out and appreciate the beauty of our surroundings. Perhaps the light of the moon and stars on a cold dark night. Perhaps the light comes to us through others - those who help and support us at home, in shops and local businesses. Perhaps the light for you is in the eyes of someone you love. Wherever you find the light of Christ this Advent, share it with others. If you can't meet, then on the phone or in a note or letter. If you have something to share, and nobody to share it with, then tell me. We are the light of Christ.

It is hard to be apart from family again at this time, and more difficult in this season than back in the Spring, when it was easier to spend time outside. However, we have both enjoyed settling into our new home and our ministry here in Woodchurch, Bethersden, and High Halden. We hope that you are all able to enjoy Christmas as best you can this year, and we will all be looking forward to better times in 2021.

Woodchurch Surgery December update

As I write, it's late November and as we near the end of 2020 it's perhaps timely to have a period of reflection and consider where we are, what has been achieved in 2020 and our aspirations for 2021.

Covid-19 has impacted us all significantly in our home and work lives. At the surgery, we have had to change our standard working practices in line with Government guidance towards more virtual consultations by phone or video and less in the traditional face to face manner. We have had to restrict the numbers of people into our waiting rooms and distance ourselves from our patients in ways we would never have dreamed of in the past. Part of that process led to the introduction of these newsletters in an endeavour to maintain communication between the surgery and our PPG members. We have now expanded the newsletter concept to monthly and they will be included within the HUB newsletter. Hopefully this will enable us to reach many more of the local community.

Right now, we are in a second lockdown and we await the Government's decision on what comes next for us personally and professionally. We continue on with the seasonal flu campaign targeting the traditional cohorts as well as the new over-50s group. If you've not yet had yours please book in with reception. We have also started planning as a Primary Care Network (PCN) how we will begin to deliver the Covid-19 vaccine once it has passed through the final testing and licensing procedures. As I'm sure you will have seen in the media, there will be strict guidance on how and to whom it can be delivered. When we know more, we'll share this with you.

Looking forward to 2021, we expect to continue to be very busy(!) contributing to delivering the Covid-19 vaccine. Hopefully, immunisation will ultimately mean fewer restrictions on all our daily lives. As a surgery, we continue to look forward and consider how we can

improve the services we provide for patients as well as encouraging good mental and physical well-being with targeted messages about screening etc. As you may have seen in Dr Hickey's November message, the surgery supported awareness of the 'Mo'vember men's health campaign.



We had a day of staff wearing stick-on moustaches on their masks although Jack went one better and grew his own. Check out what he kept hidden under his mask! It's small things such as this which have helped us maintain staff morale and well-being during these challenging times and we're looking forward to Christmas Jumper Day in support of Save The Children.

We don't yet know how the Government will allow us to celebrate Christmas, but all the staff at Woodchurch Surgery would like to wish you all a very happy, healthy and safe Christmas.

UK National Census - 21st March 2021

I would like to introduce myself to you - I am the Census Engagement Manager for South East Kent which covers both Ashford Borough Council and Folkestone and Hythe District Council. My role is to ensure that as many residents within the combined area complete the Census which is due on March 21st 2021. This will involve focussing particularly on the groups within the community that may have more of a challenge to complete the Census. For example, ethnic and European minorities with language barriers, some of the elderly population who may have challenges in completing, and many other smaller groups.

At the moment, I am raising awareness of the Census and building key contacts that can support in accessing these more challenging groups within the community. I have already set up a Census support group with Ashford Borough Council and as we move towards the Census, I will be looking to do as many events to help with awareness and understanding of the Census - how these work will obviously be dependent on Covid restrictions. I have A4 posters that can be displayed that promote the Census, and I can also do a short introduction to the Census that could be used on newsletters and websites.

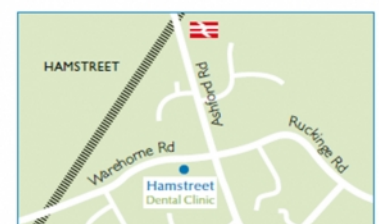

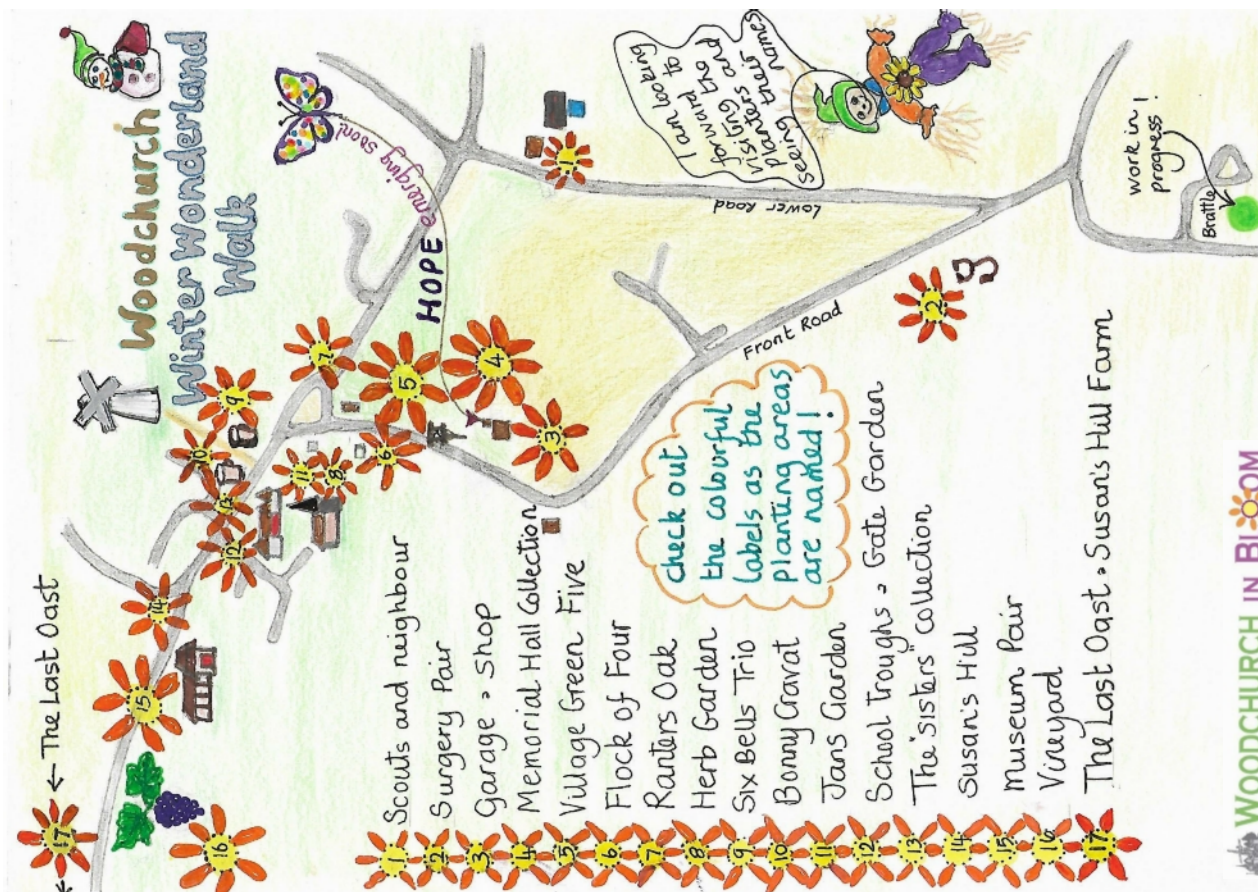
