Every household should complete the census on Sunday 21 March 2021 or as soon as possible after. The census should take about 10 minutes for the household questions and 10 minutes per person. Your answers to the census questions will help organisations make decisions on planning and funding public services in your area, including transport, education and healthcare. ### WOODCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL • UPDATE •

It's been an extremely busy month for the Parish Council with a lot of things to share with you

#### Accessibility within the village

The Parish Council has previously had some issues raised with public footpaths and pavements being blocked and not passable. We made some requests of residents to ensure that hedges were kept trimmed back to ensure the public can pass and we would like to thank all those involved for an overwhelmingly positive response to these requests- thank you for the work which has gone into ensuring that these issues have been resolved.

#### Woodchurch Village Growth

With members of the public in attendance, the PC discussed this month two new potential housing development schemes proposed for the village. The first at Stonebridge, within the southern field adjacent to the Appledore Road, where 33 dwellings are suggested and the second in the field at the end of Kirkwood Avenue, for 7 bungalows. These are significant developments for the village and your opinion is very important. To this end a short consultation survey will soon be distributed and made available via the Hub.

Please be aware, that we feel there are likely to be other planning applications discussed as developers continue to look for new plots of land to build on, so we are very keen to hear from as many Parishioners as possible with regards to what you want from any new developments and what your concerns are. The more we can understand what the village feels is needed and what is not welcome, the better equipped we are as a council to represent your views and ensure your voices are heard when developments are proposed. Please complete this survey even if you feel the current proposals are not going to have an impact on you.

#### The 2021 Census

This is being held on 21st March, and the Parish Councillors are happy to help anyone in the village who may need support completing it for any reason. Please get in touch and we will do what we can to ensure that everyone can complete it.

#### Looking after our village

The Parish Council are aware of some problems with littering on the green and particularly around the Pavilion. Please be assured that we are working on addressing this issue. We wish to thank the two fast food outlets who visit the Green car par weekly for their enthusiastic cooperation with this- they will be ensuring the bins are being used for any takeaway rubbish and will be clearly reminding customers not to leave any litter following their visits. bins provided and also to ensure that all COVID safety measures are followed:

- You cannot leave your home to meet socially with anyone you do not live with or are not in a support bubble with (if you are legally permitted to form one).

- You may exercise on your own, with one other person, or with your household or support bubble. This should be limited to once per day, and you should not travel outside your local area.

- You cannot meet other people you do not live with, or have not formed a support bubble with, unless for a permitted reason.

- Stay 2 metres apart from anyone not in your household or support bubble.

Finally, we discussed at the last council meeting that the current restrictions is taking its toll on everyone within the community. The NHS has launched further resources for anyone who may need more support with their mental health.

# All Saints Church



Hopefully, the winter is behind us now, and Spring brings light, new growth, and hope for the year ahead. The vaccination programme is going well, and I expect we are all starting to make plans as restrictions start to be lifted.

We are now in the season of Lent, which is a time of preparation for Easter. It lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays), and starts on Ash Wednesday, which was on 17<sup>th</sup> February this year. The 40 days are based on the time that Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for his ministry.

Traditionally Christians use this time of preparation as a time when they can become closer to God, and they do this in a number of ways. This is a time of selfexamination. We reflect about the things that get in the way of our relationship with God, and try to work out how we can make more time, perhaps with a new routine of reading something from the Bible or a daily reflection, and/or by making extra time for prayer. This is a time to repent - a time for saying sorry. A time for asking forgiveness from God, and also from those we may have hurt. A time for thinking how we might change our ways to be able to live out the life Jesus wants us to live. It is also a time to think about our charitable giving. Can we afford to give more? Do we have time to actively help those in need? Is there an act of kindness we could do every day - even something small like telephoning someone who might be alone.

Christians often also use this time to practice self-denial. People sometimes ask "What are you giving up for Lent?" I think this year, we have already given up so much. Perhaps this is a year to focus on the other aspects of Lent.

In the middle of Lent we have Mothering Sunday, or Mother's Day, celebrated this year on 14th March. In days gone by when workers had little time off, this was a day or half-day set aside to visit your "Mother church" where you grew up. This was a day when domestic servants - mainly daughters - could visit their mother and family. A day to give thanks for our Mothers, including those who are no longer with us. We are hoping to reopen our church for Sunday services from Mother's day; it will be lovely if you can join us for our service at 11am.

#### Important information regarding the future of Woodchurch Windmill


As Ashford Borough Council (ABC) are now able to resume several projects that were put on hold due to the Covid pandemic, we were finally able to meet with them (virtually) regarding the future of Woodchurch Windmill. As ABC are the owners of our Mill, following the recent damage that it sustained, they obtained an estimate for its repair just before the start of the pandemic that was in the region of £200,000.



Each year ABC review all of their assets and decide which they are going to keep, which they should review and which they should dispose of. This year our mill has been placed in the "under-review" category. Our meeting with them was very positive and they stressed that no decision had yet been taken regarding the Mill's future. As part of the review ABC are obtaining alternative estimates for the repairs and they have requested that we consult with Woodchurch residents regarding their views about the Mill's future. We have been asked to provide this feedback to them by the end of March.

Should ABC decide that they can no longer justify retaining ownership of the Mill there could be several options they could consider, including passing over full responsibility for the village to maintain, or even to sell it privately.

It is therefore important that we, as a village, can convey to ABC why the Mill is so important to the Woodchurch community, and why they should continue to own and maintain it into the future. #### Woodchurch Surgery Update

I've woken up buzzing this morning and can't sleep after all the excitement yesterday despite the minor celebration that last night was Friday night. I've been asking the team this week for any snippets to tell the wider community and after picking up 50 vaccines from Charing on Friday was feeling positive but wary that slow steady progress is being made. Nurse Sarah Trigg had organised a motivational sunflower growing competition to keep the team going. Mine is now planted and Libby has called it "Terry".

I got back to an amazing sight in the car park where there was a sign pinned to the fence from Woodchurch Primary School - "Thank you from Woodchurch Village". The detail is brilliant and the colours are so bright and vibrant. The individual letters are wrapped in vinyl so should be weather proof and will stay in place for a long time to come so please come and see it (I might apply for a protection order from the council!).

Philippa from the PPG (Patient Participation Group) had asked if she could have a chat for 5 minutes at lunchtime, so I boiled the kettle and went outside not knowing what to expect.

After a photo shoot by our new sign made by the School, Philippa gave a lovely speech and presented a large poster made up by Claire Town with lovely, supportive, motivational comments from the community. We had just been discussing how to brighten up our very clinical interior and this piece is just perfect and will be a permanent boost to the team. We already have some lovely art work donated and will continue to add to it.

Philippa presented an enormous car boot full of donations from the village and even a collection for the end of lockdown celebrations. So generous and so very appreciated - as said yesterday we have all chosen to do our jobs but to work for and with a community that gives so much makes it so worthwhile. Thank you to everyone.

After the climax of the event we had a debrief in the surgery and everyone was so proud and were sharing the event with other members of the team that weren't there. Poignantly Keely Harris (our Social Prescribing lead) was present in the background. She is slowing returning back to work having lost her husband, John, to Covid in January. I think seeing what the wider surgery team means to the community was a great inspiration to her coming back.

A regular Friday afternoon put the day's events to the

back of my mind and when I got home I proudly showed my wife, Lisa, a video that someone had taken of the day's events. It was amazing to see it back and be able to share a really special moment which helped it all sink in a bit more. We will be able to show all the team that weren't there too so thank you to the secret camera person (Lesley Bird).

It was also a nice welcome for our new GP Trainee, Dr Seema Chakravati, who drives from Canary Wharf every day to our little oasis. She has taken over from Dr Lutuf Mian who passed his exams and is starting work at Ivy Court Surgery on Monday. It is great news that we have some local retention of our trainee doctors as we invest a lot of time and (public) money in training them and then often they go elsewhere. Three of our recent trainees have stayed on locally and after yesterday Seema is pretty keen to stay too. For the trainees to work in an area like this provides a real contrast from towns and hospitals and is certainly different to where I trained in Birkenhead 15 years ago. We are also hosting Medical Students from the University of Kent which has opened this year for the first time and some of you may have met Declan and Lily who are enjoying their first year.

As dawn breaks today it looks like another beautiful day and this change in weather, "the vaccine" and the buoyancy of yesterday makes it feel to me as if we are a lot closer to getting back to normal and enjoying life safely and freely.

## WOODCHURCH WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

The seemingly never ending January was followed by a neat, concise February of 28 days and suddenly it's March, with lots of harbingers of spring; lighter mornings and evenings (5 o'clock in the evening as I write and still a remnant of blue sky and a watery sun shining), and lots of hardy, hopeful pure white snowdrops, with primulas and daffodils just starting to show in the hedgerows and gardens. Everything appears to be moving in the right direction as the first 4 groups of the vaccination programme have now been completed (over 15 million jabs), and yet we still cannot predict with any degree of certainty when we, as a WI, will be able to resume our monthly meetings at 7.15 pm on the second Tuesday of each month in the Memorial Hall. #### Pre-Planning information received by the Parish Council

The Parish Council and some local residents have recently been made aware of the following development proposals that may soon be submitted for formal planning application.

#### Land to the West of Bridge Close Area S62

Ashford Borough Council has recently been consulted by Millwood Designer Homes regarding pre-application planning advice for development on land to the West of Bridge Close. This area of Woodchurch has previously been designated for development under the Local Plan as Area S62. Although there have not yet been any formal planning applications submitted, the developers have provided a draft proposal for the village to consider and comment which includes the following elements:

- 33 dwellings in total
- 13 affordable dwellings incorporated in the scheme will be a mixture of shared ownership and affordable rent properties
- A mixture of terraced, semi-detached and detached dwellings
- A small number of apartments in a single block
- All houses to be 2 storeys in height with a small apartment block 2.5 storeys in height
- A potential play trail in the wooded copse area close to Bridge Close
- A single vehicular access from Bridge Close
- Parking provision on the site will exceed the required standards

As part of the planning application process, Millwood Designer Homes will soon begin their consultation with the village (through their agents DHA Planning) and they have requested the Parish Council to assist them with this consultation.

#### Land to the North of 14 and 15 Kirkwood Avenue

Ashford Borough Council has recently been consulted by C.S. Developments Ltd regarding pre-application planning advice for development on land to the North of 14 and 15 Kirkwood Avenue. This area is not included in the Local Plan but would fall under Windfall Development within the village. This developer is currently in the process of building the three detached properties on Lower Road.

Although there have not yet been any formal planning applications submitted, the developers have provided a draft proposal for the village to consider and comment.

 7 detached bungalows, comprising of 3 x 3-bedroomed and 4 x 2bedroomed



- The use natural slate on the roofs and handcrafted clay tiles on vertical elevations, with handcrafted face bricks, similar to the materials currently being using on the 3 dwellings on Lower Road
- A 10 meter strip of land to be retained at the rear of Plots 1, 2 and 3, which will be divided between the 3 plots, as an extension of amenity area for allotments.
- The opportunity for the Parish Council to have ownership of areas of land for Ecological Enhancement
- There would be no more future development on this land.

It is expected that the consultation process will begin during March and it will be coordinated through The HUB. It will be as inclusive as possible for all residents (online, Social Media, email, printed paper etc.) and you will be able to contact The HUB if you need help in responding.
