## WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

When I joined the team in 2011 the Surgery became accredited as a training practice for junior doctors wanting to be GPs. The community has been great in supporting them and they have all assured me that their experience at Woodchurch will be fondly remembered. Local retention of doctors that have been trained in Kent has always been low, so I am proud that of our previous trainees one remains with us (Dr Arinaitwe), one is taking a partnership with New Hayesbank and one has joined Ivy Court. Our latest trainee, Dr Chakravarti, is joining Wye surgery in October and will extend her experience in Obstetrics and Gynaecology but also develop her new interest in Dementia - I wish her all the best in this role and she will be a credit to the team at Wye.

So, in August we welcome Dr Mukundh Putkoor who is a second year GP in training and brings with him several years as a doctor in hospital medicine. He will be with us for 4 months and should be back with us next August for a year.

In August we also welcome back Dr Henrique Lourenco who should be with us for 6 months to complete his training. He has already spent a year with us and then spent time down in Herne Bay and we are pleased to see his return.

Along with this news we will see a return of medical students from the University of Kent. Last year we hosted the first new students and some of you will have met Lily and Declan who were very enthusiastic and great to have around. Our new students will be in their second year and will spend a 2-week block with us at a time. I'm sure that they will be as popular as Lily and Declan were, and I thank you in anticipation for enabling them to learn.

So, the start of the new academic year will certainly be busy for us. The extension and refurb will be used to the max and these will be new faces that people will encounter. The GP trainees are all qualified doctors with hospital experience and come to us to evolve their knowledge and relate to the community as a GP. Although they are supervised by me the whole team have a role in their education. Similarly, we occasionally supervise Student Nurses who you may meet through the year.

I suspect a number of our trainees have been a bit surprised to end up in Woodchurch having only experienced hospitals in inner-City locations, however they have all understood the value of our community and enjoyed their experiences here. To see that realisation gives me as much pleasure as them passing their exams and I look forward to Mukundh and our second-year students having the epiphany that a small rural community is a hugely rich learning opportunity that inspires them to stay in Kent to enjoy working as GPs.

This educational role is massively important for the provision of primary care in the future, and we are really proud to be involved. Thank you for all being so welcoming to the trainees.

## WOODCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL • UPDATE •

The PC this month has been looking at various projects, some ongoing and some brand new!

An application for finding has now been submitted to KCC for the Brattle bus stop renovations- watch this space and we'll update you when we know more. We are also looking at what can be done to improve the bus stop outside of the surgery after a resident brought this issue to our attention as well.

On 21st July contractors completed work on the flagpole which means it is now fully functional again and looking like new. Thanks to everyone who had to be patient while the work took place and took up a part of the car park for the day.

The very same day the PC Chair attended the unveiling of the Hope Butterfly, dreamt up by Windbloom and created by the very talented people of the village. It is now a permanent installation outside of the Memorial hall, and looks really fantastic. Thanks to all those who took part in this amazing project and for Winbloom for overseeing the project, to the school children and others who have painted so many beautiful stones to make the butterfly as striking as it is, and to the Memorial Hall Committee for agreeing to host the instillation in front of the Village Hall. We are so pleased that the project has been such a success and a lasting reminder of how the village pulled together to support one another in the last 18 months.

The PC is also working on a project to try to bring electric car charging points to the village car park. We are keen to hear your views on this idea - do you feel this is something you would use if we were to install them? Any thoughts you have on the plan which would involve a couple of charging points in the car park would be most helpful, as we will be discussing this issue at our next meeting on August 19th.

One of the topics which was raised in the PC meeting in July was the ongoing concerns from residents about the issue of speeding in the Village and surrounding roads. If you have any thoughts on this then please do get in touch. The Speedwatch initiative is hoping to restart soon, having had to pause during the pandemic. If you wish to be involved in this please get in touch with the PC and we can pass your details along to the Speedwatch team.

Finally, we hope the whole community is looking forward to a lovely summer, and if you are looking to entertain your children or young people, please take a look at the Reconnect programme being run by KCCwww.kent.gov.uk/education-andchildren/schools/reconnect

This website lists many activities to get involved with, and also offers free bus travel for 11-18 year olds through the

summer, as well as family passes if you have children under 11. The Reconnect programme is also offering dramatically discounted passes for local leisure centres to allow children to use the passes to go swimming over the summer for a fixed fee. Definitely a website worth looking at if you have a young family to entertain!

Finally, as some of you will already be aware, there is a new planning application for a proposed development of 40 houses which has been submitted to Ashford Borough Council last week. The PC will of course be looking very carefully at this development and would welcome as much feedback from the Parish as possible before we are asked to submit our thoughts on it. We will be discussing this application at our next meeting on 19th August, so please feel free to submit your thoughts to us before this date, or else come along and share how you feel in person at the meeting. We appreciate this is a proposal which many residents will feel strongly about and we want to be able to represent your views as clearly as possible when we discuss the application.

## All Saints Church

Dear Friends, I hope you are keeping safe and well, and enjoying a few more freedoms after this difficult year. Thanks to all who support our church in any way - it has been wonderful to see the churchyard transformed after each of



the volunteer gardening weekends. I am very grateful to those who give their time.

This month I want to let villagers know that All Saints church is really struggling financially. We are in the midst of a project to replace our heating and lighting in church, and this will use most of the funds we have in the bank. For those of you who may not be aware, we do not receive any central funding for maintaining our beautiful Grade 1 listed church building. Sadly, church income has fallen, but we still have regular maintenance and insurance commitments and repair work to do, as well as plans for improvements and redecoration.

Some of our future plans are to:

- $\bullet$  Repair to front churchyard wall leaning badly and will cost up to £70,000 to rebuild/repair
- Remove some pews at the rear of church to give
- greater flexibility in how we use our space
- Repairs and improvements to doors

We have applied for a number of grants to supplement our funds. Fundraising events held to supplement the weekly plate collection have had to be cancelled during the pandemic, but are now starting to be organised again. As members of the congregation, we are tasked with maintaining a safe and fit place for future generations to worship, to visit and as a place that helps everyone to mark the milestones in their lives as it has done for over 700 years. The Church is open for private prayer every day.

We hope you can help to ensure the church stays open in our village for many future generations to come. Please support us as we start to organise fundraising events. Please consider a regular standing order donation, or a one-off gift. Our bank details are: account name: Parochial Council Woodchurch; account number 74392875; sort code 60-01-21. Cheques and cash donations can be put into the safe just inside the church door; we have Gift Aid forms available on request.

If you have an interest in historic buildings, and have time to help we can always do with help and support with building management - it can feel a very onerous responsibility to be looking after a building which has been around for such a long time.
