This month we co-opted a new Councillor onto the Parish Councillor - Paul Glasgow. He joined us for a very busy first meeting on 19th August and we are very pleased to welcome him on board. We still have a vacancy for another councillor, so if you would like to get more involved in the village and lend your time and skills to the community, please do get in touch through the Web site www.woodchurchhub.uk or by contacting the Clerk on clerk@woodchurch-pc.gov.uk.

At this meeting the updated by-laws for the village green and the signs for the village car park were also approved and these will be on display shortly. The updated bye-laws have clarified several of the existing items and the car park signs will make it clearer that overnight parking is not permitted in the car park without the express permission of the Parish Council - something which we have had issues with recently.

The council is also on the lookout for some local expertise to support the work we do.

Firstly, if any residents are knowledgeable regarding flag flying protocol (when and how the flag should be hoisted and which flags should be flown for certain occasions etc.) please contact us if you can help in ensuring our flag pole is always properly adorned!

Secondly, we would like to know if there is anyone in the village who has knowledge and experience of managing green areas and who would be able to provide expert advice to the Parish Council regarding the maintenance of our village green spaces. This would include liaising with our local sports teams and volunteer groups and advising in the appropriate frequency and height of mowing of the grass on The Green and maintenance of the wildflower meadow. If you think you could help then please get in touch.

WinBloom are looking to organise a Windmill Path Tidy. We are very pleased that they are taking the time to do this as the path up to the Windmill can be extremely difficult to navigate. If you are free in October when they are holding their two-day event, please do get in touch with them and offer your support.

It has been brought to our attention in the last month that the fence around the play area has been damaged. If you notice any damage to the equipment or fencing in and around the play area and adult exercise equipment please contact The HUB (01233 861381,

enquiries@woodchurchhub.uk or clerk@woodchurchpc.gov.uk immediately so that we can ensure it is safe and can affect any necessary repairs.

Finally, this month the Parish Council meeting had a large attendance of residents concerned with the new planning application. In response to the outline planning application (21/01284/AS) for the development of 40 new dwellings to the west of Front Road, Woodchurch Parish Council has

submitted an objection notice to the Ashford Borough Council (ABC) Planning Department. The developers outline planning application has all matters reserved, except for access, which means that detailed planning information such as layout, architecture, drainage, ecology, etc., will not be submitted to Ashford Borough Council until a later stage in the planning application process. Our objection consequently focused on the following elements associated with access:

- Land take in excess of the Policy S40 site (i.e., some 375%)
- The large number of dwellings (40) proposed and associated access roads
- Departure from the ribbon development layout that currently exists along the western edge of Front Road
- The use of a single access road to enter the proposed development area
- The dangers of the single access road, aligned on a blind bend along Front Road
- The dangers of a steeply graded access road
- Access road adoption within the proposed development and the potential cost implications to future residents
- Concerns with development access to Woodchurch village's foul water drainage system and plans to address its current inadequate capacity
- Access road runoff and storm water flood mitigation
- As this is a major project for Woodchurch, the requirement for additional design information and further community consolation between villagers, the developer, Southern Water, ABC and other associated parties.

Public Rights Of Way - PROW

It is wonderful to see so many walkers out and about the parish continuing to enjoy our many marvellous countryside Public Rights of Way (PROW) footpaths that surround the village. As the pandemic continues it is important that we all continue to respect other walkers, our natural environment, land owners and farm animals by:

- Parking carefully so as not to block pavements, access to gateways and driveways;
- Checking the PROW route on a map before you start so that you do not get lost;
- Keeping to the marked paths and not wandering off onto private lands and property;
- Leaving countryside gates and property as you find them;
- Following the marked paths and giving way to others where it's narrow;
- Leaving no trace of your visit by taking all your litter home;
- Keeping dogs under effective control, especially near other walkers and farm stock;
- Never leaving dog poo on PROW verges and footpaths, bag it up and take home or place in a village red bin;
- Following advice and local signs;
- Landowners keeping PROW's that pass over their land open by trimming back trees, hedges and bushes as needed
- Washing your hands after the walk.

Wildfower Meadow on the Green extension

Volunteers who planted out wildflowers in the meadow last May will have noticed that their efforts have been rewarded, with some localised



splashes of colour in the designated areas. We were lucky that it rained hard immediately afterwards! Hopefully these plants will now seed themselves further into the surroundings as they are carried about by the hay harvest. The meadow should soon be receiving its annual cut. After this, when the hay bales have been removed, we plan to temporarily cover a few small sections with tarpaulins, in order to suppress the most vigorous areas of grass, allowing us to introduce more wildflower seeds and plants this autumn.

We will be planting out more seedlings on Sunday 31st October between 11am and 1pm. Thank you again to all the Villagers who have been helping with this and continue to do so.

The adults (or 14yr olds and over) can enter the 5 mile or the two lapped course of the 10 mile. Starting near Place Lane on The Green, the course takes runners down Lower Road, round the entire kite shape of the village, then off to Susan's Hill out past the Woodchurch Vineyard and back round to the village via Boldshaves and Redbrook Street to finish on the green. A single road closure from the crossroads of Redbrook St / Bethersden Road all the way down through the village on Front Road to the junction with Lower Road. The closure is just for the Sunday morning, with the bulk of the race lasting two hours. For those that need access via the closed road, a little planning ahead, will minimise any inconvenience. The race starts at 9:30am and the last runner is done by 12pm.

Prizes galore at this event! Bespoke medals all round and a bottle of wine from Woodchurch Vineyard for those that prove to be the fastest Man or Woman in the 10 and 5 mile races. This year the medal is the result of the winning design of the competition entered by every year group of the village school.

The Schreiber-Webb Family by Jon Chaplin

Karl Schreiber was born far away in Durlach near the German city of Karlsruhe. He moved to London in the 1740s and traded in furs, building a fortune that his descendants were to enjoy. Karl later lived at Enfield and Tewin a village now near Welwyn Garden City. Karl was quite a character, having three wives and nearly four. His first-born son William grew up at Tewin, and later moved around living in Ipswich, Bures on the Essex/Suffolk border and in the New Forest at Brockenhurst. He bought Hengherst at Woodchurch towards the end of the 18th century and his eldest son John Charles inherited the estate when William died in 1821.

John Charles Schreiber married Amelia Cameron in 1823, taking up residence there in 1828. John Charles was our village squire for 40 years until he died childless in 1863. Amelia carried on at Hengherst for another 20 years and Duncan Cameron her nephew kept her company there, with his family.

In 1883, Amelia died and the estate was inherited by Arthur Schreiber (pictured left), a nephew of John Charles. His wife Elizabeth (below) was a Yorkshire lass. In the photographs, she looks somewhat severe but Arthur appears to have been a gentle soul who was well-loved by those who knew him well. They had just one child, Evelyn (third picture), who inherited the Hengherst estate when Arthur died in 1902.



In 1899, Evelyn had married an army man, Captain Somerset Edward Deane Webb. Evelyn was very active in Woodchurch affairs, donating regularly to All Saints as had John Charles. The couple had three children, a boy and two girls. The eldest was known locally as 'Tommy'. Evelyn died of skin cancer in 1931, leaving Hengherst to him.

The estate included many properties in Woodchurch with a total of over 2500 acres. Evelyn was worth a total of over what would have been £20 million in todays values. In 1937 the estate was auctioned off and

Tommy (below) moved to Ireland. Thus ended 114 years of Schreibers as the squires of Woodchurch. John Charles, Amelia, Arthur, Elizabeth and Tommy all lie in All Saints churchyard near the western end of the church.
