

WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

As I reflect on the achievements of October I feel an ache in my legs that reminds me our team completed the brilliantly-

organised Woodchurch 5mile run on Sunday. We were all really pleased to take part and complete the course with the assistance of a the Marshalls are local volunteers





The 5 miles around Woodchurch in fair weather has been dwarfed by the

incredible story of "Three Dads Walking". If you haven't seen the coverage, it is the determination of three fathers who have lost their daughters to suicide and by walking over 300 miles to raise awareness of mental health and the charity Papyrus whose goal is suicide prevention. While October has celebrated Black History Month and Breast Cancer Awareness, November will try to raise awareness of Men's Mental Health and Prostate Cancer, their stories highlighted that suicide came at the most unexpected time for them. As a society we are getting better at talking about mental wellbeing but the 3 Dads' message is to encourage us to go further and not shy away from us talking openly about suicidal thoughts with friends, family or professionals.

Onto the Covid Boosters... We had a temporary leave of our senses and had been talking of doing a walk-in immunisation clinic at Charing until we pictured the scenes of chaos and gridlock. If you heard the rumour, please do not turn up uninvited at Charing on Saturday the 6th November. Instead, we are booking people into appointment times on Saturday 6th November splitting the PCN's appointments between Ivy Court Surgery in Tenterden and Charing Surgery. Having covered the 450 or so living in care homes we will be inviting the "extremely vulnerable" and over 80's first then down to 75's if we still have appointments left. I'm pleased to see that a large proportion have gone elsewhere for their boosters demonstrating that we are a really engaged community in the fight against Covid - perhaps we want to spend Christmas together this year?

We have been really lucky with the weather so far but are planning to make the dispensary waiting area a little more weather-proof for the winter. Please remember that if you have difficulty getting prescriptions that there is a daily delivery for routine items - so please contact the dispensary if you need to use this service. While we don't have the corporate clout of the big pharmacies, we want to be able to provide our rural community with what you need so we are

trying to develop this service within the constraints we have.

Amazingly we don't have any new members to the permanent team this month to welcome but have met our two new medical students who will be with us for blocks of a week at a time. We have Hugh and Yuta with us this year and I appreciate your patience and understanding if you get to meet them.

Nigel Hawkes - 1943-2021

Nigel and his young family moved to Well House on Front Road, Woodchurch in 1980. He was Science Editor of The Times and then Health Editor. In 1999 he was awarded a CBE for services to journalism and to science.



I got to know Nigel in 2002 when Woodchurch Windmill needed a bit of

tender loving care. A public meeting elected a new committee of The Friends of Woodchurch Windmill (FWW) with Nigel as Chairman. Nigel's forte was fund raising. He wrote some letters and over 50 thousand pounds arrived.

Nigel was ever gentle, articulate, realistic, modest and balanced. He told us - "old windmills go through a continuous cycle of restoration and decay". He wrote - "a windmill is an inspiring example of the continuity of village life". Nigel's committee helped Woodchurch windmill back on its feet and the sails turned once more. He resigned as our FWW chairman in mid-2006, giving us all a farewell drink at the AGM.

Nigel loved Woodchurch and seemed never happier than when working in his garden which he enlarged in his mid-70s. Few saw him quietly sitting out at the back enjoying the view and the fruits of his labours. We shall miss our neighbour two doors down and are thinking of Jo, Georgina, Will, Alex and the grandchildren.










Sunflower Competition presentations



Meal Delivery Service in Woodchurck <u>Drivers Needed</u>

Following the announcement in the October newsletter that the Tenterden Hub would be able to begin delivering hot food to Woodchurch residents in need, sufficient people have come forward to request the service. In order for it to commence we still need volunteer drivers who would be prepared to deliver the meals.

This would entail collecting the meals from Tenterden (ready to deliver and stored in insulated hot boxes) and deliver them to the residents in Woodchurch. This delivery will take approximately an hour. You would not be expected to deliver food every day and with sufficient volunteers this could be as little as once per week.

Using E10 petrol in our 2-stroke garden equipment

We fill up and use fuel in our cars on a regular basis, whereas our lawnmowers, strimmers and other garden machinery will sit around with fuel left in them until we next use them. E5 has 5% ethanol and E10 has 10%. Ethanol is hygroscopic, which means that it naturally attracts and absorbs any moisture in the air. When you add fuel that contains ethanol E5/E10 to your fuel tank, any moisture in the air inside the tank will mix with the ethanol in the fuel, which eventually results in water and

ethanol being sucked through the fuel system. This can result in

components deteriorating and difficulties in engine starting and running. 2-stroke engines are very badly affected by this as they do not have a specific lubrication system. The water leads to the separation of the 2-stroke oil/petrol mix resulting in the oil not bonding to the engines metal components - and without lubrication the



engine will rust. The extra ethanol content can also result in the rapid deterioration of older fuel lines and rubber seals that are not designed to be used with the E10 fuel.

More recent models of garden equipment will have been manufactured to work with E10 fuel, but to ensure that you do not damage your machinery you should check its compatibility with the manufacturer.

The older E5 petrol will still be available from some garages, albeit at a higher price. Ethanol-free petrol is also available in cans from garden machinery suppliers. It is advisable when using E10 fuel in a 2-stroke machine to mix the 2-stroke fuel in small batches that will be used quickly, and also to empty the fuel tank after use when the equipment is to unused for any length of time - Advice from Webbs of Tenterden.
