WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

What a great start to the month with 4 days off for the Jubilee and a huge turnout for the impressive Woodfest. It was pretty brutal returning to work after a such a short week but then we had our own Woodchurch Surgery celebration getting together for the first time in over 2 years to reflect on how the team have worked hard for each other and patients alike. It was a well-deserved celebration and the first time many of us had seen each other without facemasks in a long time.

The latest government advice has allowed us to open the doors and make face-masks optional for all staff except the "clinical" staff (i.e. Doctors/Nursing team) who still have to wear them when seeing patients. Patients can wear a mask but we ask that any who have new coughs/flu-like/covid-like symptoms wear a mask to protect others in the building.

Sadly we have seen Sophie leave us from the Dispensary, and thank her for all her efforts having started just after the first lockdown. To replace her we have now welcomed three newcomers to the Dispensing Team. Rebecca is a qualified Dispenser we also welcome Denise and Karen (Kaz) who will be both front-of-house and prescriptions clerks. We have become so busy that we hope the addition of these roles will help streamline the journey of a request to a take-home medication and allow the Dispensers to get on with their roles. We still aim to turn-around all repeat requests within 3 working days.

Next month will see the arrival of Ryan Mowat who some of you may know as "Ryan-from-the-hospice". He is a senior Nurse who has walked the boards here before as a District Nurse 10 years ago and is keen to come back to the community to support our Care Homes and Chris Hamilton (our Nurse Practitioner) with all the work she does.

I'm pretty excited about July as I have two weeks off with the family and plan to go to Mallorca. We've grown pretty used to the entitled feeling that if we book a holiday we should be there to enjoy it, however the world is on it's head at the moment. I guess we're paying for the chance of getting there and staying where we have booked, so if it happens it will be amazing. With all the publicity about cancelled flights and strikes I'm a bit nervous - interestingly you can get some good info on the "health benefits of going on holiday" but there don't seem to be any health benefits of holidays being cancelled. Hopefully the holiday season will be good for lots of us and not too many cancellations experienced...

With support from the Hub, Parish Council and village residents we now have a defibrillator for public use outside the dispensary. We hope that no one ever needs it but will give the south end of the village a lot of comfort.

WOODCHURCH WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

On a gloriously sunny evening in June Sue Howell gave a talk entitled "Laura Ashley - An Inspiring Woman," which seemed an eminently suitable topic for the start of summer, for who can forget Laura Ashley's romantic, floaty, floral, summer frocks of the 1970s and '80s? Indeed they seemed to capture the very essence of summer! Sue's speech was divided into three parts - Laura's early life, her life as a wife and mother and life as a business woman. We learnt that Laura was born in 1925 in Merthyr Tydfil, Wales. She was the eldest of four children and her grandmother was a great early influence on the young Laura, which continued when in 1938 Laura, aged 13, was evacuated back to Wales from the family home in Croydon. Unfortunately, as rural Wales was considered to be a safe haven, many other, even younger, children were also evacuated to Wales, This created a scarcity of school places and Laura was obliged to attend Aberdare Secretarial College in order to continue her education. At the age of 18 she met her future husband, Bernard Ashley, who was confident, out-going and gregarious - in fact everything that Laura was not, but she had, thanks to her grandmother's teachings, a determined air and an inner strength, which meant she was more than a match for Bernard and as she had decided that Bernard was the one for her, they married in 1949!

From 1942-1952, Laura worked as a Secretary for the National Federation of Women's Institutes and while working for the Federation and raising the first of her four children, Laura undertook some development work for the Institute on quilting, a craft she had learnt from her grandmother. A Woman's Institute display of traditional handicrafts at the Victoria and Albert Museum inspired Laura to design her own fabrics to create headscarves, napkins, table mats and tea towels. The couple, who at this time, were living in a small attic flat in Pimlico, invested £10 in wood, dyes and linen and Bernard, being very practical, was able to manufacture a screen frame so that Laura could produce her very first scarves. Soon she had persuaded John Lewis on Oxford Street to take two dozen of the scarves on a sale or return basis and was delighted when they very quickly wanted a further supply.





Laura now had a business, which gradually became successful enough, thanks to Laura's strong work ethic and ability to juggle working life and looking after 2 lively children, to enable Bernard to leave his city job to print fabrics full time. The family spent a brief time in Kent, before moving, with their (by now) four children, back to Wales to continue to develop the business. There they employed local folk and proved themselves to be very good employers. Laura's first shop was opened in Wales in 1961 and eventually, as adults, all four children were involved in the business.

Tragically, in 1985 just after her 60th birthday, Laura fell down the stairs one night while staying with her daughter, Jane, in the Cotswolds and she died in hospital ten days later. She was certainly a truly inspiring woman. Thank you, Sue, for delivering such an interesting talk.

WI Ladies who lunch

Woodchurch Women's Institute...... It's not just Jam and Jerusalem

Founded in 1927, Woodchurch WI celebrated its 95th birthday a few months ago, and we would dearly like to make it to 100 in 2027! But to do that we need new members. If you're a woman, aged over 18, that's you!

This is what one 24 year old said about her WI in Berkshire: "I joined the WI because I wanted to listen to inspiring talks after a long day at work. Since graduating and starting fulltime work two years ago, I quickly realised most 20somethings' lives were a routine of going to the gym, using social media and working long hours. Instead I wanted to support local charities, go on trips with other women, carry on learning and to bake! The WI seemed like a perfect fit."

Many people have the idea that the WI is for oldies. Well, it is, but it's also for younger members too. Each WI is different and the activities we do really reflect the member's interests, whether that's craft, volunteering, sailboarding or engaging with the local community. That's because, although we are affiliated to the National WI, each individual WI is run by its own committee, which plans a programme for the year. So if a WI member has ideas about what they would like to do, they can either put themself up for election to the committee or let a committee member know what their idea is. We have a suggestion box at each meeting. And if the subject of one meeting isn't your thing, it may well open new horizons, or even just be an opportunity to relax and socialise.

So what do we do at the moment? We have a meeting once a month, except August, in the Memorial Hall (second Tuesday at 7:15) and each month we try to do something different. This year we still have to come talks on The History of the Theatre Royal, Perfumes, and Lewes-The Bonfire Night Capital of the World. We also make time for refreshments and a chat at all meetings.....we are a very friendly institute!

But that's not all. We have activities outside the main meetings. 'The Ladies who Lunch' meet once a month at a different restaurant or pub in the local area. It's very informal and you don't have to make a commitment to go every month....we're all busy sometimes.....just sign up for lunch at the previous monthly meeting so we know how big a table to book. We usually have between 6-10 at each one, so it's a good size to chat and you can choose what you want to eat from the menu. We don't have a set meal. In the photo you can see six of us enjoying June's meal at Montalbanos, the Italian restaurant in Tenterden. Our craft club meets up once a month too, again informal.....you don't even have to sign up for this one. Bring your own craft to do while we have drinks and a chat....and if you want to learn a craft, or get advice, we're there to help each other. We even have one lady who comes for just the chat!

We also actively support the local community. In February one of our members held a 'Souper Lunch' which proved very popular and provided funds for the School and the Surgery. We also support things going on in the village by talking about them at our meetings and encouraging members to join in, as well as having speakers from different local, and international, charities which allows them to raise their profile. Earlier this year we invited a doctor who spoke about the Mercy Ships.

Being part of a national organisation also has its advantages. All members are able to access 'My WI' online, which has details of our campaigns (in 2022 it is to support women with ASD and ADHD) and a host of activities such as cookery, craft, floral art, culture, science and more. We also receive a magazine in the post which comes as part of the yearly subscription. If you are thinking this sounds good, but are not really sure, our meetings are open to visitors free of charge. Come along once or twice, and then we ask you to join on the third meeting if you decide it suits you.

This is a huge honour and will only ever be for the few. It is not decided on ability only but on character, kindness and dedication. 

The Dog Walking Code

For safe and happy walks with your dog, and to avoid causing problems for others:

- 1. Ensure your dog is under effective control, which means:
 - You have a short lead with you and use it when needed (e.g. around livestock, near cliff edges or where signage requests it)
 - You do not let your dog off the lead unless you keep it in sight and close enough to come back to you on command
- 2. Prevent your dog from approaching horse riders, cyclists, or other people and their dogs uninvited.
- Keep your dog with you on paths or access land and don't let it stray into crops including fields of grass, fruit and vegetables.

- Never let your dog worry or chase wildlife or livestock. Follow advice on local signs to reduce disturbance to plants and animals.
- 5. Stay SAFE around farm animals and horses:
 - Stop, look and listen before entering a field; are of any animals present
 - · Always keep your dog on a short lead • Find the safest route around animals, giving them plenty of space and
 - using paths or access land where possible Exit the area calmly and quickly if threatened, releasing your dog to make it easier for you both to reach safety
- Never leave bags of dog poo lying around, even if you intend to pick them up later. Containers and deodorised bags can make them easier to carry. 8. Ensure your details are on your dog's collar and it is microchipped, so you can be reunited quickly if it is lost.
 - 9. Keep your dog's vaccinations and worming up to date. Ask your vet for more information

6. Always bag and bin your dog's poo wherever you are. You can use any public waste bin or

your bin at home.

Contact your local authority, or look out for signs, to get more information about what to do and where to go in your area.

Two of the village's Scout Troop give up one night a month to help the WI set up the meeting hall with chairs and tables and then they return at the end of the evening to put everything away. The award includes helping the local community which these two are definitely doing. 



From all at the Carnival Committee, a massive thank you for your support and making the comeback Carnival to celebrate Jubilee a

successful weekend. We would also like to thank everyone that made the day happen, with putting up tents, running bars and stalls, selling, and running round, just doing bits. THANK YOU!

All those who made the parade a success a great show, well done to the winners it was a tough job judging. The bands that played and retro cars, scooters, steam engines - you made it. The band of the Princess of Wales Royal Regiment were fantastic - well done Tigers. To the pilots of the spitfires seeing them roll over The Green was a dream that we thought we would never achieve, but thanks to Bill Giles for all the advice and shifting the flight pattern - we look forward to the steam rally.

We could not believe the numbers who came to celebrate - many travelled a long way to attend. With good music, food and drink, the funfair and the stalls and displays, a good time was had by all - and at the end of the day the green was spotless. Roll on 2024, when we hope that we can do it all over again and the Carnival will return again.

The team met after a small recovery break to review the Carnival and some of the aims of the weekend.

- Large community event incorporating individuals and groups, so they continue to support each other in the future.
- To build on the community spirit and recognise that some may need help and that its OK to ask.
- To promote inclusivity in our community and provide opportunities for all residents to work and play together.

• To enhance opportunities for the people of Woodchurch to build relationships, volunteer and be involved with coaching and learning new skills.

- To support local businesses and bring revenue into the village.
- To promote Woodchurch village and encourage visitors.
- To raise funds for local groups working for the benefit of the community of Woodchurch.
- To have fun!

From the feedback we have received we achieved this and more. We did not start out with the intention that the Carnival would make money - we wanted to support the local community and for everyone to have fun. When the Carnival was over and the dust had settled we were pleased to see that it has also been a financial success. Some details below:

• In order to hold the Carnival we managed to raise £14,000 from grants and donations. The cost of running the Carnival was £14,000. Part of this cost has left the village with community assets (including a marquee and radios) that will be available for use by clubs, societies and organisations for future events.

• Many items on the day were subsidised to ensure that the day was affordable for all families.

• We originally hoped that we could put £1,000 back into the community after Carnival. Due to the success of the day we can now confirm that this amount is now £3,000. Clubs, societies and other village organisations will be invited to apply for some of these funds - more detail to follow.

• Knowing how much it cost to put on the Carnival this year, we have secured a sum of £8,000 for the Carnival Committee to use as their seed fund for 2024.

• We have invested in trophies that will be used in future carnivals and donated a commemorative plaque to display on the village beacon.

So, what's next?

The photos and videos are being collated - please add photos on our Carnival Web site www.woodchurchcarnival.uk or send them through Facebook. These will be put together in a souvenir booklet and held in the Museum. It may also be available to buy - more detail to follow.

We also need people that may remember older carnivals, we would like to interview you for the video. Please let us know if you would like to take part.

We will work out how the assets bought for the carnival can be best loaned/hired out to other village organisations.

An open meeting will be arranged in next few months for the purpose of establishing the new committee for Carnival 2024.

What we have achieved this year shows what can be achieved in a very short time with a positive attitude and determination. THANK YOU!
