#### 2A Bus Service

We are aware that from 13th August Stagecoach is removing the Sunday service for the 2A bus which serves Woodchurch. It is unclear whether this will also include bank holidays which run on the Sunday timetable. Unfortunately, these services are provided directly by Stagecoach and not by KCC, but we are in communication with KCC to see if there is anything that can be done and will be liaising with Shadoxhurst and Kingsnorth parishes who are also affected by the cut.

We are also aware that other local villages have had their whole service removed and that in response to this there is a public meeting being held in Bethersden on 7th July which a representative of the Parish Council will attend to report back any information that may be relevant to us here in Woodchurch.

By removing the services they have, Stagecoach are making it clear they are looking at them on a commercial basis and will end services that do not have enough income, regardless of how that might affect and isolate residents. The best way to ensure this does not happen is to continue to use the bus services as much as possible.

#### Roads

We are continuing to work closely with KCC on a variety of matters concerning the roads around the village. One thing we know is always of concern is speeding and we are pleased

we know is always of concern is speeding and we are pleased to share the below speed reports from KCC for key areas in the parish. They make for interesting reading and indicate that the average speeds (in blue) are generally below the speed limit, which is really good news. Of course, there will always be exceptions to the rule and we are continuing to explore options with KCC but on the whole the news is positive.

We have also had confirmation from KCC that they are going to install an additional school warning sign on Bethersden Road, up the hill towards the Windmill giving drivers advance warning of the school and hopefully reducing speeds further round the bend at the Susan's Hill junction.




## **Overgrown Hedges**


We have had some concerns from residents about hedges overhanging footpaths making it difficult for pedestrians to pass, something that is of particular concern to those with prams, wheelchairs or mobility scooters. If you have a hedge bordering a footpath, please ensure it is maintained to allow the full width of the footpath to be used.


Whilst the general rule is that hedges should not be cut within the period 1st March to the 1st September, to support our wildlife, if they are causing a risk to health and safety, they can be cut back regardless of date.

Please see the attached letter we have received from KCC about this.



Dear Resident

Every year throughout the spring and summer KCC Highways & Transportation receive numerous complaints regarding trees, hedges and other vegetation, which overhang the highway from private property. This matter can pose a number of problems for people trying to use the footways, especially if they are trying to pass with buggies, wheelchairs and scooters. It would be greatly appreciated if you could ensure that any trees and hedges that are bordering the Highway are maintained and cut back to your boundary which would greatly benefit all Highway users. This will help us all keep the highway safe and prevent the need for KCC Highways & Transportation writing to you requesting that you cut back your vegetation.

So that you are aware of our requirements, please refer to the text below.

#### If the boundary of your property borders the footway, then please be aware that:

The full width of the footway/pavement must be available for use by pedestrians. As well, there must be a minimum height clearance over the footway/pavement of 2.1 metres/7 feet for any vegetation.

#### If the boundary of your property borders the carriageway, then please be aware that:

If you have vegetation that overhangs into the road, there must be a minimum height clearance of 5 metres/16 feet to accommodate buses and HGVs that may use the road. If your property is rural, then vegetation should be 0.45 metres/1.5 feet behind the edge of the road and all signs need to be kept clear of foliage.

Also, we would ask that you pay special attention to your trees, hedges and vegetation if your property is on or near a junction, and/or inside the bend of the road, to maintain maximum visibility for road users.

## WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

One of our Social Prescribers will be in The Hub on the first Thursday of each month from 1pm until 4pm. They will be available to discuss just about anything that is not medical but will help improve the quality of life with assistance around medical and social services. They will be happy to discuss any concerns directly with you or someone else on your behalf. They will also be available by telephone via The Hub so if you can't get down please call.

They are involved in starting a "wobble class" for men to back up the already successful class for mixed groups that helps improve balance for those at risk of falling (or those worried about falling). This is a 12-week course that is currently free and has proven to help reduce falls, improve confidence and also has a social aspect for those that want to stay for a coffee afterwards.

We are planning for flu season so are preparing to jab all people over 65 and those under 65 with long term conditions. Last year the guidelines included those between 50 and 65 but this year that group is not part of the cohort. We are thinking about doing some drop-in clinics and some pre-booked clinics and hope that everyone gets behind the flu campaign. We still don't know the plans for Covid vaccines but as a PCN are expecting to sign up to provide vaccinations in the Autumn.

We have had quite a lot of requests for "diet injections". These cannot be got at the moment as there is a supply shortage in the UK. They are injections that were designed for diabetes and help to suppress your appetite and have now been approved by NICE as a treatment for obesity. They are not licenced to be given by GPs for weight loss so we would refer you to weight management services. You can refer yourself via "One You" that is a free service for lifestyle improvement around weight, exercise and smoking. Just search online for "One You Kent" and it will come up straight away.

At the end of July we say a sad farewell to Dr Mukundh Puthoor who has been with us for the last 2 years as a trainee. He will be moving on to the next stage of his training and we wish him every success and have really enjoyed his contribution. Dr Lauren James remains with us for the whole of next year and we expect a new first year trainee to be with us part-time in August. Thank you for your engagement with our trainees who learn so much from the community here.

The summer is definitely upon us and it seems that everyone has a spring in their step. We all wish you a healthy summer with lots of sun protection and please be careful with the random DIY projects and garden tools that come out once a year and lead to a visit to A&E!



## 'Connecting Woodchurch'

Thanks to all our groups/clubs representatives who came to give an update on forthcoming events in our Village at our 'Connecting Woodchurch' meeting on 21st June.

At the meeting Bill Giles provided an update regarding details of the Steam Rally and Road Run, and also update about 'Wings & Things'

#### Steam Rally 2023

"This is year 10 of the Steam Rally and we are making a little bit of a special of it. I got asked over the last four or five years by



exhibitors whether we could make it a three day show however all the extra work of just putting on a single extra day is actually quite a lot. So what we've agreed to do for the exhibitors is rather than have three days on site, we are going to have two days on site (Saturday and Sunday), but Friday we are going to make it a "road-run" day. The exhibitors will be starting off from the rally field and rather than displaying only on the field, we are going to be running a route through which will pass through the village, down to the bottom, turn left and past the Rare Breeds Center and into Ham Street. From there it will go through Ruckinge, past the old house of Thomas Aveling (who was a famous steamroller builder) and then on to Bilsington Priory where we are going to stop for lunch. And then from there in the afternoon, we will wend our way back through Shaddoxhurst and back to the rally field. So there will be guite a lot on the road. We are not setting specific time for people to leave, so it hopefully it will allow a sort of a gentle flow away from the rally field rather than blocking the roads up. Hopefully for some people it will be a nice opportunity to see some vehicles out on the road, rather than just on the rally field."

## Wings & Things

"I am planning to revive wings and things. I was hoping to do it this year, but unfortunately we came unstuck slightly with car parking facilities. We hope very much that that is going to change going



forward for next year. So I am looking to revive it, to some degree or another. It probably won't be quite so much the heavy "war bird" aircraft that Rob had back in the day but there certainly will be some. It will be very much aviation orientated and my personal hope is that if we can make it a success. Wings and Things used to provide proceeds for the Museum and Museum building back in the day and we might look at another project in the village that that Wings and Things can support locally. It is very much something for the village as much as for the general public to come and see."

# WOODCHURCH WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Plants, trees and gardening have been a common feature of this month for Woodchurch WI, as on 1<sup>st</sup> June a select

number of members met to unveil a plaque for our adopted tree, a Field Maple, planted recently in the wild meadow adjoining the village Green as part of the late Queen's Canopy of Trees in honour of the Platinum Jubilee. The inscription reads "Planted by



Woodchurch WI to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II, 2022". The WI Logo "Inspiring Women" is also inscribed upon the plaque. Following a brief ceremony to mark the occasion in situ, members (and grandchildren, for it was during half term) were pleased to adjourn to the Old Post Office Coffee Shop for a welcome, warming drink

and a slice of their delectable cake; the weather still being a little bit chilly then!

Flowers were then very much a part of our meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> June when we were pleased to welcome 4 visitors - Dawn, Elaine, Linda and Theresa, (and, of course, all our other members) to a talk and demonstration of flower arranging in a jam



jar given by Linda Crew of "Woodchurch Cottage Flowers". Lin came equipped with a vast array of foliage, flowers, grasses and even some weeds; indeed who knew that a stem of Rumex is actually a herb from the Buckwheat family which includes docks and sorrel? "And, yes," Lin explained, "it can still look very decorative and effective when skilfully incorporated into an arrangement with other much grander blooms". Linda always tries to make her work Eco friendly and, hopefully it reflects the surrounding countryside. Whilst deftly working on her demo arrangement, Linda maintained an invaluable stream of advice to help make our own



eventual efforts more appealing. She told us to always work in odd numbers of stems, that the stems should always be cut at an angle of 45 degrees to aid water uptake and also the position of these stems in relation to the other blooms. She also advised picking stems in the early morning or late evening to ensure longevity for the

finished bouquets and to start with the outer green foliage and work inwards to the focal, but not too tall, flowers. ## The Brougham (pronounced "Broom")

In the 1950s, it was painted white and used by the Bonfire Boys in their celebrations on November 5th when the lighting of huge bonfires on the Green was preceded by a torchlight procession around Woodchurch. The white-painted Brougham was pulled by a volunteer team. Each year between 1952 and 1958, it carried invited TV and film celebrities who would light the bonfire and later grace a dance. The whole event raised funds for village charities. It was also used for weddings around that time.
