At the meeting on Thursday 24th August, the Chairman welcomed the Interim Clerk, Mary Philo, standing in briefly till the new Clerk Ian Philo takes over the reins.

As part of good risk management, the council is reviewing all its policies and procedures whilst at the same time considering its financial standing in light of all of the work that needs to take place around the parish over the coming year.

The council soon plans to survey the entire parish to discover what residents want to see happen in the village. The results will inform the council for next year's spending and help to set the 2024-2025 precept (the share of your council tax that goes to the parish council).

Highways have provided the council with a free speed toolkit aimed at reminding drivers to keep to the speed limit. Within it are banners that will appear, for a few days at a time, around the village. Proven experience is that erecting banners for short periods is more effective.

The council agreed to buy a new St George flag as the current one has seen better days and will start working on the plan to provide new notice boards around the village.

WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

The big talking point at the moment is Covid. Why change the habit of the last three years?

The talk, though, is of vaccines and not of deaths and disaster which has to be positive. We desperately want to ensure everyone is as safe as they can be and make Covid be a bit like Flu. We have been doing Flu vaccine campaigns for years and seem to be managing that well.

The government gave us our Flu targets twelve months ago so we have committed time and money to achieve this. We were due to "agree" to the Covid vaccine by the end of August and were asked in July to cancel our Flu clinics and wait until a suitable Covid vaccine has been decided upon and deliver both at the same time.

The past contracts for giving Covid have generally covered the costs of our nurses, however, a huge number of other staff and volunteers have turned out to help in the effort to beat the virus. As a PCN we recognised the need to vaccinate and get the disease under control and we all turned out to get on with it. Now, though, we are fatigued and cannot muster the energy without proper engagement from the health authorities. We are not alone and believe that there has been minimal take up from Kent and Sussex to deliver: Covid Vaccines so far.

I'm sure that there will be more about this in the next couple of weeks and that we will find a way to be protected. We are in it together after all. In the meantime, we will carry on with out planned Flu clinics so please come along as planned.

One of the many things I enjoy about ministry is learning about family history, and the links between many of our village families going back many generations. This month we are looking forward to welcoming 65 members of the Henden family to Woodchurch. They are travelling here from all over the world for a grand family reunion, as they traced their family to Henden Place on the Green around 700 years ago. Over the time I have been Rector, I have heard from a Woodchurch family in Australia, and also recently a man in New Jersey who has traced his family back

400 years to Bethersden. I wonder if you have looked at

Mike and I are both from Irish descent - we discovered that we are both descended from Irish dockers - Mike's ancestor came to work at the docks in Hull, and my ancestor came to work at Newcastle docks. On Mike's 60th birthday we will be in Dublin. We hope to visit the Anglican Cathedral where his 13th Great Grandfather, Thomas Jones, was the Dean. He became Archbishop of Dublin and Chancellor of Ireland. I haven't found anyone like that in my line, but there was great great uncle Maurice who did some amazing mosaic work in a church in Droitwich Spa. Family trees are interesting - I wonder if anyone will find me in three hundred years time in my descendent line? And what will they think of the history of the 20th and 21st Centuries?

Recently our PCC met to review the mission plan we put together and circulated early last year. We feel that we have made a lot of progress during the year, and we hope that this has been noticeable to our parishioners. We have produced an update and a plan for the next year or so - I hope this is useful. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you would like to ask anything or provide feedbank. If you have not yet come to see us, please call in - to admire our wonderful historic building; to pray or meditate quietly; to let your children enjoy our play area - maybe even to join us for worship on a Sunday morning - you will be very welcome.

All Saints Church Woodchurch Mission Plan 2023 Update

The Parochial Church Council PCC have been thinking about how the church relates to those who live in Woodchurch (our parishioners), and how we might better serve the needs of our village community. As well as being a focus for faith in the centre of the village, we would like to be a place of generosity, and hospitality, open and available to all. This Mission Plan Update sets out what has happened since we published our vision in April 2022, and sets out our plans for the next couple of years and

What have we achieved – with the help of our parishioners?

- · Our Youth Worker started in April last year, and we also have a Youth Worker provided by Kent County Council - we run a weekly term time after school café and youth group - Blend for children aged 10-12
- Our coffee mornings have been a great success we welcome folks aged from 0-99 (babies up to more mature guests) who enjoy a chat and a cuppa on Tuesdays 10-12
- We set up "Here to Help" a charitable account taking regular donations which are used to help those in need in our village; we use funds to run the foodbank and provide food vouchers and other help for families and anyone struggling financially
- School links children regularly visit church, Revd Sue visiting classes, Revd Mike supporting chess club
- We upgraded our heating system, providing a warm space for parishioners during cold winter months
- We installed Wi-Fi for community use



- · We have organised a series of concerts and events to welcome people into church and assist with fundraising
- We have started to offer family services and more contemporary worship, an annual pet service, and traditional language early morning communion and evening services
- · Village weddings for those who want to marry in church and have a local reception
- We held a Christmas tree festival in 2022 which was very
- We have implemented our churchyard plan to balance the need of those who visit family memorials, and to protect and nurture the wild flowers and wildlife - this will continue to be refined



- Refurbish our disabled toilet
- Setting up a "prayer station" where adults and children can leave prayers for anyone you would like us to pray for
- Providing a welcome pack for those who move into the
- Provide improved disabled and pushchair access with a ramp and internal glass doors
- Improve our space for community and intergenerational use of the building
- Offering confirmation classes for children and adults
- Bereavement support, and sessions explaining how funerals are planned, and how the churchyard works
- Improve how we share the story of our building with those who visit; especially for families
- Consider how we can improve our welcome for ad hoc visitors
- To further develop a variety of service styles
- To continue to develop our outreach to those in need in our community
- To find more volunteers for our work in the church and
- To continue to fundraise in order to realise our plans

On Monday 4th September our speaker for the evening will be Jon Chaplin. Jon is one of our founder members and his talk will be about 'Romney Marsh on the Front Line'. This is actually a tribute to one of our previous members, Adrian Luff. The presentation will be in the Memorial Hall at 7:30pm.

Adrian had planned his presentation for March 2014 but unfortunately ill health prevented him from doing so. Adrian has since passed away but Jon has undertaken to deliver the talk for him.

Adrian did his National Service at RAF Rye (situated at nearby Guldeford) from 1954-6. The establishment was a Chain Home Radar Station during WW2. Four tall masts and a receiving station helped detect oncoming German aircraft remains of the site can still be seen today. Adrian eventually gave lifetime service to the Ministry of Defence, being responsible for radar projects throughout the UK.

If you are interested in becoming a member of the Woodchurch Local History Society (WLHS) the half yearly fee from September to December is £6. If you wish to attend as a visitor for this talk an entrance fee of £3 is payable at the door. There is no need to pre-book - just turn up on the evening. All are welcome.



Woodchurch Village Shed has had a good month. As you know we meet every Thursday from 10am to 1pm at the Community Hall.


Members of the Shed have been busy with minor repair work at the Hub and Pavilion, members have undertaken

If you are interested please come along it is only £3 a visit and £20 pa to join.



In July we were pleased to have the scouts from Husburg near Hamburg, Germany for a week. An advance party arrived on the Thursday bringing both tents and food. They are not keen on our



food as I think the last time they came over they tried Marmite which put them all off!

On **Saturday** a coach arrived with 52 enthusiastic, though tired, scouts and after eating everyone investigated the village and used the activities on site - Archery, Shooting and Bouldering - plus we taught them how to play Viking chess. All went to bed early and slept soundly.

Sunday morning everyone was awake early looking for coffee or tea. The German young leaders were well advanced with breakfast so we got out of the way. That morning we joined forces with the outreach church for tea and cake. Lunch was a wonderful roast dinner at the Six Bells.

Monday saw us visiting Canterbury and the Cathederal and then on to Dover Castle. Once the mist had cleared they could see France from the castle. Then back to Woodchurch and after tea they got to ring the bells at All Saints Church.

On **Tuesday** we hiked. Some started in Woodchurch and hiked to Dover, others started at St Margarets and also hiked to Dover. Both groups stayed overnight in a scout hall in Dover and some of the oldest Young Leaders spent the evening in Dover town.

Wednesday it was up to London - some by coach and others by train. We all enjoyed exploring London using travel cards before meeting up in Leicester Square for the journey home. By the time we got back to Woodchurch Janet and Lye had tea waiting for us. On Thursday we took the steam train to Bodiam Castle from Tenterden. The train was packed and it unfortunatly broke down on the way. We were told that it was because of "the wrong coal" - which makes a change from the "wrong type of snow" - but we arrived at Bodium in the end. After visiting the castle we all piled back onto the train - only for it to break down again on the way back to Tenterden! During the month of August, just a couple of weeks later, we had 12 Canadian Scouts from Toronto visit us for 4 days. The program with them was fun, though much less hectic. I would like to thank all leader and parents who helped during the camp, also the Parish Council for allowing us to fly the German and Canadian flags on the Green.

In Woodchurch we need to find an additional leader to take on a new role of Squirrel leader - for both boys and girls from 4 to 6 years olds. It would only be for 1 hour once a week - time to suit.
