ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

All residents are invited to attend the Annual Parish Meeting (alternatively referred to as the Annual Meeting of Electors) which will be held in the Memorial Hall Annexe. The focus this year will be on the councils Draft Annual Plan and Budget 2024-2025, copies of which are available for comment from The HUB, from the Parish Council Web site and will be available at the meeting. We will also explain the Call for Sites process (see below)

### Slight reduction in Parish Council tax

Despite increasing costs and an ambitious plan for 2024-25, the Parish Council is the only one of the five tax-levying bodies not to increase its element of the Council tax. The



table below shows how your Council tax for 2024-25 is made up and what percentage of it goes to each authority. Change from 2023-2024 shown in brackets ()

- 73% going to Kent County Council (increase of 4.75%)
- 12% going to Kent Police and Crime Commissioner (increase of 5.3%)
- 9% going to Ashford Borough Council (increase of 3%)
- 4% going to Kent Fire and Rescue (increase of 3%)
- 2% going to Woodchurch Parish Council (decrease of 0.2%)

### **Call For Sites**

The recent call for site by Ashford Borough Council (ABC) saw over 330 responses across the borough, with 8 being within



Woodchurch. The full list is freely available on ABC's website. Over the coming months ABC's planning department will be sorting through each individually, filtering out the ones that don't meet the relevant requirements. Later this year a "short list" will be sent out for consultation with parish councils. At that point comments reflecting the views and opinions of the residents can be reflected back to ABC. Just because a landowner has responded to the "Call" does not mean that it will necessarily make it to the next stage. Woodchurch Parish Council will keep residents informed.

# WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

After a couple of weeks of Kate Middleton getting a lot of stick for various reasons the press have done a major U-turn following her cancer diagnosis. As a doctor the lack of detail always frustrates me but I appreciate that even such a public figure is entitled to her privacy. What it may do is raise concerns for people that if someone so young, slim, looked after and rich has developed cancer so what hope for the rest of us? The reality is that at 42 cancers are still uncommon and the median age for cancer diagnosis is 66 years old - so half of cancer is diagnosed older than this age.

Generally children are most at risk of brain, bone and blood cancers (leukaemia/lymphoma), then as we enter our teens testicular tumours join the cohort. Into our 20s and 30s cancers become less of a common diagnosis until they rise again in our 40s. During this time skin cancers like melanoma, breast cancers, thyroid cancers and genetic bowel cancers become increasingly common. Over 50 all of the cancers become more common but the average age of bowel, breast, prostate, lung, ovarian, bladder, pancreatic and skin cancer are all in the 60+ age range.

We all tend to worry about cancer and the diagnosis can send shockwaves through a family, however there is a lot of progress in treatment and support for people and their families living with cancer. The Cancer UK website has a lot of really useful information about the many sides of living with cancer and is a good resource to look through. It also has a focus for healthy living - it almost seems silly to say but avoiding smoking, excessive alcohol, obesity and excessive sun/UV will reduce the risk of cancer as will staying active and eating healthily.

It would appear that Kate had a more longstanding problem and it was felt time to intervene, only later the sample has been looked at on a cellular level and cancer has been found. This highlights the need to be symptom driven at this age and report ongoing changes that arise. These can then be investigated but routine screening is only done for people at risk from genetic factors such as a diagnosis of bowel cancer in a first degree relative under 50, or part of the national cervical smear programme. As a 42-year-old her bigger threats to life would generally would be from mental health problems or road traffic accidents. However from this age there is more risk from developing high blood pressure, high cholesterol and musculoskeletal problems like arthritis.

We have the long Easter weekend which falls at a good time for a break as we will have reached the end of the year for chronic disease monitoring. Although the new year starts on April 1st the contract with any changes to targets doesn't usually get delivered to us for a couple of months in its' final form. The murmurings in general are really about the development of cardiovascular disease and the role of cholesterol in this. New evidence suggests that anyone suffering from "chronic kidney disease" would benefit from a statin to reduce cardiovascular disease so there will be more

work in this area. It really seems that lowest is best for all ages.

We have waved a sad farewell to Kim Field who has retired but welcomed Georgia to the reception team who has hit the ground running. Otherwise the team will be back after Easter, full of chocolate so energy restored for full steam ahead.

Dear Friends,

A Happy Easter to everyone in Woodchurch. It has been lovely to visit the school for RE lessons and to welcome everyone into church for the school Easter Service this week.

# All Saints Church



I wanted to take this opportunity to mention our church finances. I know that some of you will feel that the church is wealthy and should not need to ask for money. However, this is not the case locally. This is a difficult time - the recession has hit us in the same way it has hit many of our families.

We will continue to provide "Here to Help" using separate charitable funds which runs the Foodbank, and provides vouchers for families who are struggling and other help such as counselling for some children. We will continue to run the Youth Group each week - we employ a youth leader using funds reserved from the sale to the Mission Hall years ago, and we also have a youth worker provided by Kent County Council. We will continue to run "Remember When We Were Young", and have been grateful for a grant from the Windmill Trust to support this important club for those suffering with memory problems and dementia. Our church tries to support the village in all sorts of ways.

Our difficulties are with our church building. We are very grateful to those who support coffee mornings and fundraising events, and we have just about managed to keep a balance of what we spend paying our bills (building insurance alone is over £600 per month). However, we now have emergency work identified to the East wall and roof which will cost £12,000. We can pay for the roof works, but the remaining £11,000 is currently unfunded. We are applying for grants which may help. We also have a generous bequest due which may help, but we would also like to install new glass doors and a disabled access as a lasting memory to the person who died.

Our accounts can be made available to anyone interested, and we are grateful for any offers of help. Our current plan is to delay the repair until around August in the hope that we can fundraise and get grant funding so that it is affordable then. We have been advised that we really cannot last another winter without repair.







The Woodchurch Local History Society (WLHS) meets on the first Monday of the month in the village Memorial Hall at 7:30pm. Our meeting on Monday 1st April features an illustrated talk by local author



features an illustrated talk by local author Ed Adams - his subject will be 'Ashford's Worst Day - The Great Air Raid, 24th March 1943'.

Ed Adams has written a book about Ashford's experiences during WW2 and this time he will focus on the town's worst day in terms of bomb damage and in the number of casualties. On 24<sup>th</sup> March 1943, the German Luftwaffe set out to bomb Ashford's Railway Works

out to bomb Ashford's Railway Works but the raid also resulted in many neighbouring roads and businesses being wrecked. Worse still, 52 civilians died and a further 78 residents were seriously injured. The accompanying photo is of



Hayward's Garage which was destroyed that day.

The pupils at the local primary school had a lucky escape. Miss Adams, the head teacher, heard the sirens and very quickly moved her schoolchildren to the safety of bomb shelters built under the playground. Much to the relief of the gathering parents no child was affected .Miss Adams received an award for her actions.

Next month, on Monday May 6<sup>th</sup> we have ex-teacher and local historian Josie Mackie give us an illustrated presentation called 'Creeping Like Snails - A History of Schooling in Woodchurch'. She will tell us how village schooling was conducted from the earliest recordings to the present time. The talk will be in the Memorial Hall, starting at 7:30pm.

Members of our society pay an annual subscription of £12 and visitors pay £3 at the door. If you wish to come as a visitor on April 1st or May 6<sup>th</sup> then please do so - you will be very welcome. There's no need to book - just turn up on the night. New members are also very welcome.
