



Distribution of responses within Woodchurch Parish








How many people in each age category live in your household






If you use the public transport, approximately how many return journeys per month would be made by your household




Excessive speed of vehicles along Brook Street - dangerous. Have raised endlessly with Parish Council/police/Highways. Nothing has been done




Do you think that the police work well with the local community to identify and address local crime and disorder issues




What is your perception of crime in Woodchurch compared to 5 years ago






Have you been a victim of crime or antisocial behaviour in the village in the last 5 years








Accessibility and Inclusion




Have you attended a Parish Council meeting in the past 3 years




