WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

July has been an amazing month for sport and August is going to keep giving with the Olympics uniting so many different nations and cultures. It is incredible to think of so many people coming from so many different places living together for 2 weeks and the infrastructure that needs to be put in place, including an entire medical facility. This seems so far away from the restrictions of the pandemic.

While it is admirable that people will be inspired to take up sports from these events, it is important to choose the right exercise. The NHS live-well website encourages over 65s to



focus more on strength and flexibility and less on highintensity exercises. As we get older our bones become more fragile and our joints stiffer leading to more imbalance and risk of falls. Activities that raise the heart rate should be encouraged for 150 minutes a week which includes heavy digging/gardening, carrying heavy shopping etc and doesn't need to be formal exercise.

For people that find moving regularly and exercising more challenging we do have local classes to improve balance and fitness. These are known as "Wobble" classes and can be done sitting or standing.

People often stay for a bit afterwards so has a slightly social side too. If you're interested please ask the Surgery.



We also have regular free Healthcoaching sessions which are run weekly with the aim of getting to 5km by the end of the sessions. This can be walked, run or just attempted. The current course has just started and the next 10-week course starts in October. It is paid for by the PCN and has had great feedback - if you are interested have a look at this: https://www.b2rhealthcoachingservices.co.uk/

Whooping cough is still high in the community and we encourage any pregnant women to ensure that they get fully vaccinated to help protect your newborn baby. I think there have been 5 baby deaths attributed to whooping cough which is 5 too many in view of the availability of a vaccine. Uptake is much lower now than in 2017 which may be a bit of vaccine fatigue after covid - if you aren't sure please ask and we can talk things through.

Badminton at the Memorial Hall

All Saints Church

Dear Friends in Woodchurch,

I have asked our curate Maria to write a letter of introduction to everyone this month. Maria is a curate - this is a three year training programme for those who are called to be a Vicar or Chaplain in the Church of England. She will be serving in our Parish of Denswood (Woodchurch, High Halden and Bethersden) for her curacy - we are delighted she has joined us.

I have been asked how we are doing financially, and how much money we were able to raise at our recent Porch Swing Blues concert, so I am setting this out here. We had a wonderful evening at the concert on 15th June, and I am very grateful to our volunteers, and to those of you who supported the event. We raised a total of just over £1700, which is a fantastic achievement. It was great to welcome so many into the church for what felt like a real community event.

Overall, the church is in better shape financially. We have been very fortunate to obtain a national lottery community fund grant to cover repairs to the East Wall and the boundary wall (£18,000), so work has now been able to commence.

We have also been very fortunate to have received a bequest of £25,000 from a long-standing member of the congregation, and we are very grateful for this. We hope to use part of this donation to fund a disabled ramp and glass door entrance to improve accessibility for wheelchair users and those with pushchairs and prams.

However... looking after All Saints Church is a bit like painting the Forth Bridge! We now have issues with our boundary wall next to the school playground, and we have another £18,000 estimate to put things right (currently seeking other estimates). We have some funds to put towards this repair, but we also have bills to pay. Our average monthly running costs for All Saints is £3,600 made up of:

- Parish Share (we pay the diocese for cost of clergy and overheads) - £2,050
- Insurance £530
- EDF electricity £440
- Clergy and other staff expenses £350
- Other expenses and utilities £230

Thanks for your understanding and continued support as we work hard to keep your church open and a sacred space and a community building in the centre of Woodchurch.



Members and guests at Woodchurch WI's July meeting recalled the forensic events of the 2004 Tsunami. David Tadd, leader of the British forensic delegation told of his Team's efforts to identify the many thousands of people killed in the disaster.

On Boxing Day, twenty years ago a huge undersea earthquake near Thailand set off a vast human disaster that was to impact upon many nations. The Thai government sought international help with the disaster. Following a COBRA meeting in London David was invited to put

together a British team to help recover and identify the dead. Within the following week the team was vaccinated, had formed a shopping list of vital equipment and gathered together photographers, scientists and forensic experts. They left Heathrow within a matter of days carrying all these essentials plus satellite phones and water. The Australian Federal Police were the first to arrive on the scene, but was soon followed by further international teams. The water surge had been so great that victims were even found several miles inland. The British team chaired the process of identification and it was agreed by the coroners that the post mortems should declare every victim had died from drowning.

Identification of the 5,600 victims was a huge and complicated task. Using, where possible, dental or medical records, cross matching finger prints, DNA and physical features it was possible over the next 15 months to finally identify the many thousands of bodies. It was essential to get the process completely correct. The final British missing person list of British subjects (about 125 people) was sent to the police college at Hendon where Family Liaison Officers were linked to the British families involved in the disaster.

Repatriation of the British bodies came through Heathrow airport where the West London coroner had the paperwork double checked before allowing for funeral director collection. This was a huge disaster for Thailand but a massive example of international support and cooperation.

Next month will be our summer outing (Members only). We plan to visit Godinton for a tour of the house and a cream tea.



Phil was always happy to make time to talk and perhaps more importantly listen to anyone. Although in the village for a relatively short period of time Phil made a difference. He will be remembered with great fondness and sadly missed by all who knew him.





New Parish Council Website

It is anticipated that a new Parish Council website will be rolled out in August. This will ensure that the council meets the necessary requirements including accessibility.

All the latest Parish Council news and documents will be posted there. Historical information will be migrated over. The existing tab on the Woodchurch Hub webpage will link you to the new site.



Your Community Explained

Woodchurch is blessed with a plethora of volunteer-led organisations, charities and not for profit companies which can make it difficult for residents to understand who does what.

Here is a list with a brief description of each:


- The Parish Council: is your democratically elected body in the village, and its members (Councillors) represent you. By law the Parish Council needs to have at least 4 meetings a year, however we meet every fourth Thursday of each month with the exception of December which is the third Thursday. The Parish Council is not to be confused with the Parochial Church Council.
- The Parochial Church Council: is the governing body for our village church.
- The Village Green (excluding the new wildflower meadow or Village Green Extension): is owned by the Woodchurch Village Green Charity, however, the Parish Council will continue to maintain most of the assets situated on the village green.
- **The Hub**: is owned by the Parish Council but is leased at a nominal fee to the Woodchurch Community Information Exchange which is a Community Interest Company (CIC).
- The Memorial Hall: is managed by a charity Woodchurch Memorial Hall Trust.
- **The Windmill**: is owned by Ashford Borough Council but is managed by a charity, The Society of Friends of Woodchurch Windmill.
- The Village Life Museum: is also managed by a charity the Woodchurch Heritage Trust.



Access to Funding

The Parish Council will seek funding to pay for projects at every opportunity as a measure to reduce costs to you the council taxpayers.

The Parish Council may also know of possible opportunities for local community groups to access funding information, and assist or direct those organisations in the right direction



Ashford Borough Council Local Plan to 2030

The Local Plan to 2030 is the long-term plan for housing and commercial development in the Ashford area. Initial submissions from developers identifying land for housing and other uses have been received by Ashford Borough Council and are now being evaluated.

Several sites in Woodchurch have been

initially identified. There is always an interesting debate between the need for homes, clean energy and the need to preserve the rural feel. We hope that as many residents as possible will get involved in that debate when the formal consultation phase begins later this year or early 2025.

Planning Applications

The Parish Council looks into each planning application in some detail, considering the benefits versus the disadvantages to the community, before concluding with a decision. However, the Parish Council is only a consultee in the planning process, which is hoped will help shape Ashford Borough Council Planning Department's final decision.

Overgrown Hedges

As a reminder homeowners are responsible for maintaining vegetation that is on their property but overhangs footpaths and highways. In the

QUARTERLY REPORT

The Council is achieving the majority of its ongoing activities as set out in The Village Plan, and running costs remain within budget.

A maintenance agreement is in the process of being finalised with the Woodchurch Village Green Charity, allowing for the Council to continue to ensure that the assets and amenities around the green remain in good order.

Some of the planned new projects are active, though physical work is yet to commence. There has been plenty going on in the background, obtaining advice and quotes, and we expect several projects to get materially underway in the second quarter.

An opportunity to apply for a capital grant was identified in late April, and an application has been made to Ashford Borough Council for up to £10,000. It was decided to combine two projects, the power upgrade to supply project and revamping the public convenience, as it was considered that this would stand more chance of success in securing the funding as a single larger project, rather than two. A decision from Ashford Borough Council is expected after the 23rd of June 2024.

Total running costs for the first quarter were £7,900 (including staffing costs of £4,270) plus VAT of £424. Total income including precept amounted to £23,326.

As of the end of June, reserves comprised £80,873 in the savings account and £6,102 in the current account. Total £86,975. However, a payment of £891 to The Village Green Charity was not made on time, therefore reserves should have been £86,084.

The second and third quarters are likely to be very busy for the Council with ongoing activities and engagement of new projects.
