#### The Hub Power Supply and Public Convenience

The Parish Council would like to thank Ashford Borough Council for awarding a grant of £11,000. These funds will help pay for the power upgrade, toilet refurbishment and provide electricity to the Village Green.

The council has engaged with UKPN to commence the cabling at the earliest opportunity. This will involve a trench having to be dug across the car park, whereas this will cause some inconvenience, we aim to keep disruption to a minimum.

#### **Litter Bins**

Over the coming months we will be rolling out new litter bins, gradually replacing the existing cast iron ones with larger hooded ones, which will help control the problem of overflowing litter.

### WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

It always feels like the start of a new year in September as the children go back to school and the slightly less busy summer is behind us at the Surgery. We look forward now to the build-up of the winter bugs and working on projects to ease the winter pressures. It is pretty obvious really that we all need more people working and more appointments but it is never that simple as there are only so many people to go around.

We hope that a successful Flu and Covid vaccination program helps and we will get started with that in early October. Last year we had a really successful "turn up on the day" session that saw an amazing community spirit, however the weather was kind and being a month

further into winter we are going to pre-book appointments. You will soon receive a text that you can use to book in using the link or please book in the normal way - appointments are set up for booking already. You are eligible if you're over 65 or are over 18 and have a long term condition. Have a look at the home page on our website for a list of qualifying conditions: www.woodchurchsurgery.co.uk.

September sees some great health events and is Alzheimer's awareness month. There are some really exciting whisperings about drugs that may be able to help prevent Alzheimer's or slow the progression but nothing that is yet available for us to use. This is great progress as dementia is the leading cause of death now and can have a significant impact on patients and their families. I would hope that in the next 5 years we are using some of these medicines in the UK on the ground.

There is also a week of eye-health awareness. Losing your sight is something that a lot of people are fearful of and vision is something that many of us take for granted. Not only



can an optician check for early signs of developing eye conditions, they can examine the smallest blood vessels that we can properly examine. Therefore if they see damage to the blood vessels in the eyes it might suggest that

you are at risk of other things such as heart disease or cerebrovascular disease. The optician picked up a cholesterol deposit before I had any heart symptoms and perhaps taking that statin early saved my life.

On a lighter note, there is world chocolate day on 13th September. I don't think that needs to be elaborated on any further...

There is plenty in the press about GPs voting for some form of industrial action. As we are independently contracted to the NHS there is no risk of strike but the GPs voted overwhelmingly against the government's imposed contract changes. What we are worried about is that there is not enough investment in Primary Care and as a result 50 surgeries have closed in Kent over the last 7 years as they cannot afford to run. There are talks about "Collective Action" and a number of things have been mentioned,

however I can reassure you that we will not take part in any action that would adversely affect patient care so you will not see any difference in how we operate.

Our new Health Care Assistant, Laura Hilder, has hit the ground running and we have welcomed our GP trainees Parisa Tarunnum and Joe Ebbrell to the team. I'm looking forward to the excitement and inspiration from the weeks of Paralympics ahead of us and will use that to motivate me to get back out running after a month off.

This week I have been thinking about the reading from Ecclesiastes which is often chosen for funerals, and includes the lines "a time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance". Sometimes our

Recently my Mum fell at home, and we have been celebrating that after a month in hospital, she has managed to get home. The Olympic Games were full of joyful moments, but we also saw the sadness of those who were injured, or did not quite achieve what they were hoping for. In Woodchurch we have recently experienced the joy of weddings and wedding blessings in church...then there is the sadness of this being a time when we have also had lots of funerals and interments of ashes.

One of the great gifts we have as human beings is the ability to experience and share our emotions. I think that is one of the reasons I love the reading from Ecclesiastes (Chapter 3 Verses 1-8) - it just seems to sum up all these times - like the ebb and flow of the sea, we all experience joys and sorrows. Perhaps the sad times help us to enjoy the good times even more.



#### **Woodchurch Local History Society**

The Woodchurch Local History Society will recommence our programme of talks on Monday September 2nd after our summer break. The society generally meets on the first Monday of the month in the Woodchurch Memorial Hall at 7:30pm. Our next talk on September 2nd is 'The Strange Story of Hastings 'America Ground' by Ken Brooks. Ken has been to us before on two occasions and he is a hugely respected

expert on the history of Hastings. The story of 'America

Ground at Hastings starts in the late 1700's and eventually



peters out by 1835. A large patch of land in the centre of Hastings town seemed to have no owner and this encouraged numerous smugglers, fishermen, squatters and workmen to settle on it.

They led a lawless life living in shacks and ship hulks. They tried to claim American style independence but were defeated by the Government in 1835. If you are interested in this strange and unique story then please come along to our meeting.

Our talks programme continues on Monday October 7th when Nathalie Cohen will give us a presentation on 'Archaeology and 2000 years of History at Smallhythe'. Nathalie was the leader of a National Trust excavation at Smallhythe investigating the Roman and Tudor age remains at the site.

Lastly, at our November 4th meeting we are scheduled to hear Keith Swallow talk about 'Nanny Goat Island'. This was the name given to Dungeness when the area was more isolated than it is now. Keith has written a book about the little known history of the area, mainly during the 19th century.

You are very welcome to come to any of these talks as a visitor by paying £3 at the door. There is no need to book just turn up on the night.at the door. We also welcome new members. As these lectures constitute a half year's programme we are able to offer half-yearly membership at £6. This arrangement will last up to December.

#### **WOODCHURCH REMEMBERS**

The 17<sup>th</sup> September 2024 marks the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the of Operation Market Garden and the Battle of Arnhem part of the campaign that liberated Western Europe from German Occupation.



During the battle one of our villagers, Pte Amos Fairbrother was recorded as Missing in Action while serving with the 2<sup>nd</sup> South Staffordshire Regt. Amos originally from London and living in Appledore, was courting Hilda Chaplin from Woodchurch before the War and played for the highly successful 1937 Woodchurch Football Team. He married Hilda in the Village Church in 1940 and then enlisted for the duration of the War. He transferred to the elite Airborne forces in 1944 anxious to see active service. One of the aims of Operation Market Garden was to capture the launch sites of V1 and V2s in Holland. This would have been particularly resonant with Amos who had seen the devastation caused by V1 to his beloved village while on leave to visit his wife and family.

Having landed by Glider near Arnhem on 18<sup>th</sup> Sep, he was reported missing on the 19<sup>th</sup> when he was last seen in the heavy fighting around the St Elizabeth's hospital when his unit was desperately attempting to relieve the 2<sup>nd</sup> Bn the Parachute Regt at Arnhem Bridge. Sadly Amos has no known grave.

PRESUMED KILLED IN ACTION

Notification has been received that Ptc. A. Fairbrother, formerly of Appledore, who was with the 1st Airborne Division at Arnhem and has been posted as missing since Sop tember, 1944, is now presume killed in action on September 22 1944.

Private Fair well-known foot baller in Apple dore and Woodchurch.

His surviving daughter who still lives

in Woodchurch has been invited by the South Staffordshire Association and the people of Arnhem on the weekend 19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> Sepember to commemorate the ultimate sacrifice made by her father.

In August Woodchurch WI members went to Godinton House for a tour of the house and gardens followed by a cream tea.

The Godinton Estate consists of gardens and parkland in Great Chart on the outskirts of Ashford. Originally built as a Tudor hall house it now boasts many 17th century features and a 20th century garden designed by Bloomfield. Overtime the various owners have added additional wings and changed the facade.

In the 1400s the first owners were the Toke family. Captain Nicholas Toke, one of the many Toke descendants, had the longest continuous residency. By 1896 the house was owned by the Ashley Dodds who began the most extensive structural alterations. Mrs. Bruce Ward purchased the house in 1917 and her grandson Alan Wyndham Green inherited the property in 1951. Before he died (leaving no heirs) he was able to set up the Godinton Preservation Trust securing the house and its porcelain collection of Sevres and Royal Worcester, plus the gardens and parkland for the public's benefit.

Two excellent and well informed guides showed members the splendidly carved wooden paneling, portraits of the various owners and many of the downstairs reception rooms. Upstairs (in his bedroom) we traced Alan Wyndham Green's life story through his uniforms and the many different hats he had worn throughout his life, all strategically placed over his bed canopy. In the final room of our tour we saw a photo of Margaret Thatcher when she visited Godinton.

Following this very interesting tour, where we had learned so much, we retired to the tea room for a delicious afternoon cream tea or cheese scones. This was a most enjoyable summer event.

Although Bob worked away in Glasgow and Preston for many years, Woodchurch was always home. He fully embraced village life, attending dances, coffee mornings, enjoying visits to the coffee shop and latterly donating two trees at Christmas to the Village Green for everyone's enjoyment.



August is the penultimate lottery draw for 2024





#### **Woodchurch Windmill Update**

Whilst it has been several months since we were last able to post any information regarding the windmill, after sustained lobbying by ourselves, the Parish Council and our local Borough Councillors, Ashford Borough Council finally agreed to a face to face meeting to update us of progress they had made since the last zoom meeting, over a year



Unfortunately, as the minutes of the meeting below indicate, they have achieved no positive progress towards the mill restoration. Further ,it is apparent that they are either unable , through financial constraints, or unwilling to work towards any resolution that would kick start any restoration works.

They are committed to "divesting" themselves of the mill at "market value" and commit the purchaser to full restoration, even though ABC has not committed any funding towards upkeep of the mill for the last 5 years. Even if the trustees of any charitable trust were to take on this proposal that would introduce personal liability which would be untenable, unless a generous benefactor was involved.

Whilst the mill remains in ABC ownership it complicates the viability of undertaking fundraising by third parties (eg, the Society of Friends of Woodchurch Windmill charity) to undertake work on the mill which would just serve to increase the market value of the mill for "divestment", to possible third parties.

We will continue to work as a team to try to achieve a satisfactory outcome, to result in restoration of the mill, but at the moment we are being stonewalled by a negative approach to these goals by Ashford Borough Council.

#### Meeting of Meeting With ABC 31st July 2024

Woodchurch Mill representatives have been trying to get answers from ABC for the past 5 years, with ABC failing to provide any constructive response. At the last meeting, held on 24<sup>th</sup> August 2023, ABC recommended the sale of windmill.

<<comment: the divestment strategy for the mill has been has been agreed at ABC cabinet level. However, subsequently the decision to sell was deferred, with no reason offered>>.

It was highlighted that the budget at ABC remains severely constrained, and going forward they would like to seek a buyer on

the open market or at auction to achieve the correct market value. However, when pressed they were unable to suggest a guide price when asked. It was noted that the windmill has several restrictive covenants attached to its ownership, which would impact on the value. ABC would require any prospective buyer to abide by these covenants and listing requirements despite having allowed the mill to fall into disrepair.

Following storm damage in January 2019, ABC had the sails and fan tail removed, for safety reasons. ABC to date has made no attempt to make an insurance claim for the storm damage which would go some way to relieve the financial burden.

It is thought that up to £300,000 would require spending to bring the structure back to the condition when it was listed. If the mill were to fail to realise a bid at auction it remains unclear what value ABC would put on the mill given that any buyer would have to assume ALL repair costs.

ABC would not object to the mill being declared an Asset of Community Value (ACV).

It was noted that KCC had brought some of their mills up to scratch, and would be useful to ascertain how much KCC spent on the repair of each one.

<ccomment; The KCC budget for maintenance and repair of the 7/8 windmills in their ownership has, we believe, been of the order of £2.5-£3million over the period since Woodchurch Windmill was damaged. Meopham windmill has recently had replacement sails, cap and fantail under KCC funding>>

It was suggested to ABC that the Mill should be added to the Historic England Heritage at Risk Register. This would add to the wider, formal, awareness of the plight of the Mill.

Action points.

- ABC to discover the KCC renovations cost of Meopham mill.
- ABC to look into why no insurance claim made and if one can be made now.
- Woodchurch to proceed with registration as an ACV.

A further meeting was penciled in for 2 months.
