#### WOODCHURCH SURGERY UPDATE

The Autumn is upon us and we can all enjoy conkers and piles of leaves to play in. It should all be good for the soul and when we have finished playing we can then celebrate the various health campaigns for October. "Stoptober" has been running a long time and aims to help people contemplate

stopping smoking. Support and medication to help with stopping smoking can be accessed through One-You-Kent which is easily found online and has other services to promote healthy living.



Sober-October prepares us for Dry-January and while there is some discussion around moderating alcohol consumption with One-You-Kent, the only specialist service for support is through the Forward Trust which is based in Elwick Road, Ashford. They take self-referrals by telephone or online and can help with those that feel are drinking excessively or have lost control of drinking. There is now no real "safe limit" but the Department of Health advise that over 14 units a week is potentially harmful. This equates to about a bottle and a half of wine or about 5 pints of ordinary beer.

Breast Cancer awareness month is also celebrated and we can only encourage women to attend for screening. The rates are still relatively low at about 70% and is available for all women between 50 and 71



year old. If you realise you have missed out on screening or are not sure where you are with it please call 01227 783000.

I have met a number of people who have benefited from the Health Coaching that has been going on throughout the year and am impressed by the effect it has had on mental and physical health. There are more sessions being organised so please ask to join up. For those men that could not realistically walk, jog or run there is a specifically men's sitdown class starting almost immediately at Tenterden, and there are still some spaces available.

There are no team changes at to report at Woodchurch Surgery. We have 3 weekends of Covid and Flu jabs that have been well booked already and we look forward to the energy of the sessions.



#### **Woodchurch Village Green**

Charity number 1205468

The Woodchurch Village Green Charity is the legal owner of the Village Green and car park and works closely with Woodchurch Parish Council to ensure that the Green is maintained for the enjoyment of all Woodchurch residents and visitors. As a registered charity, all fixtures located on The Green are assets of the charity, and these include the Pavilion, children's play and adult exercise area and the village pump.

#### **The Beginnings**

The Village Green Trust was established in an indenture on the 24th August 1859. The trust was established to manage "a piece of land of irregular shape, situated in the Parish of Woodchurch, containing in the whole by estimation six acres, or thereabouts, and known as the Village Green".

The Village Green Trust was later registered with the Charities Commission as the "Village Green" charity on the

16<sup>th</sup> July 1925 and the land (which includes the Village Green, car park and the grass strip along the North East edge of the road called "The Green") was registered with the Register of Town and Village Greens on the

12th March 1968 - Registration # VG.55

It became an incorporated charity on 27th October 2023, at which point its name was updated to the "Woodchurch Village Green" charity with the registered objects "To oversee the upkeep and management of Woodchurch Village Green to further or benefit the residents of the parish of Woodchurch"

#### **Income**

The only direct income that the charity currently receives is

from the clubs and societies that make regular use of the Green, the Pavilion and its other facilities. It is also reliant on receiving donations.

The charity is fortunate to

receive generous grants from

the Woodchurch Parish Council that help with its day-to-day upkeep (grass mowing, utility costs, repairs etc), without which, these services would not be possible.

#### **Enhancing The Green**

The charity would also like to thank both the Parish Council and Ashford Borough Council for the grants that have

enabled the installation of power to the bottom of The Green - near the entrance to the car park. This will enable greater use of the Green for future community activities, including the village Christmas tree lights\*, Fairs and Carnivals and also local club and society outdoor exhibitions and plant sales. During the summer



months The Green and the Pavilion have been increasingly used for outdoor family events and children's parties.

#### **Moving forward**

There is a lot still to do to on The Green with urgent repairs and maintenance required to the Pavilion, safety inspections and updates to the children's play area and adult exercise Area. The Pavilion needs attention to make it usable for mixed gender sports, more accessible for those with mobility challenges, the flooring needs replacing and the kitchen needs updating. Areas of The Green also need additional drainage to keep them accessible through the winter months and to enable winter sports (e.g. football) to be played throughout the season.

Whilst we are already working with a local company to identify options for moving forward with the Pavilion building, all of the works will require significant funding to be raised in order for this and future work to be carried out.

and their children and grandchildren can continue to enjoy this created world.




#### **Citizens Advice Bureau At Woodchurch HUB**



#### **Woodchurch Local History Society**

The Woodchurch Local History society generally meets on the first Monday of the month in the village Memorial Hall at 7:30pm.



We have a varied programme of talks by experienced speakers covering local history. We choose interesting subjects usually dating from the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries but our October meeting takes us further back in time.

On Monday October 7<sup>th</sup> (7:30 pm) we welcome Nathalie Cohen to give us an illustrated presentation entitled 'Archaeology and 2000 Years of History at Smallhythe'. For three years Nathalie was the National Trust Project Leader at Smallhythe excavating land near the house which was once the property of Ellen Terry. The team expected to unearth

relics from the Tudor age when the area was known to specialise in the building of naval warships. Instead, the team discovered many more artefacts from the Roman era. These included pottery pieces and many roof tiles and other



building materials bearing the Classic Britannia insignia. This tells historians that Smallhythe was the home for a unit of the 'British Fleet', which was a subdivision of the Roman Navy charged with patrolling the English Channel.

You are very welcome indeed to come along to the talk as a visitor, paying £3 at the door. There is no need to book - just turn up to the Memorial Hall on the night.

Alternatively, if you are considering becoming a member we can offer a half yearly subscription rate of £6 which lasts until February next year.

Next month, on Monday November 4<sup>th</sup>, we are scheduled to hear Keith Swallow tell us about 'Nanny Goat Island'. This is essentially the story of the Dungeness peninsula in the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century when the isolated fishing communities there depended upon milk supplies (coming from a resident population of goats).

Finally, visitors to both or either of these talks are very welcome as are new members.

I had the honour and privilege to escort Mrs Barbara Davy to Arnhem to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of Arnhem where her father Amos Fairbrother



was missing in action on 19<sup>th</sup> Sep 1944 while serving with the South Staffordshire Regt. of the 1<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division. In a series of moving ceremonies Amos was remembered culminating at the main ceremony at the CWGC Cemetery Oosterbeek which was attended by HRH The Princess Royal . Barbara and her daughter and granddaughter laid a wreath on behalf of the family, Woodchurch Remembers and Woodchurch Football Club. They also laid flowers on the graves of Unknown members of Staffordshire Regt one of whom may be Amos. All the graves are also attended by the Arnhem Flower Children. Margaret Morris Movement gentle exercise for the over 50's will restart on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 14:15 at the Scouts Community Centre.



In September members of Woodchurch WI were introduced to the history of "Grandma's Workbox" and the items she would

have stored within it. Our speaker, Jean Surrey, had on display containers from chatelaines to exotic ivory inlaid wooden boxes along with their contents such as pins, needles, reels of thread and tape measures.

Originally, needles were so expensive that perhaps only one could be afforded. Hence they were kept in special containers to protect them from damage and rust. However, with the Industrial Revolution





needles became cheaper and could be purchased in paper packets. By 1835 the flannel "needle book" was popular and at a similar time the needle "threader" was invented. A small piece of emery was kept to rub along the needle to remove any rust.

Until the development of wooden cotton reels, cotton threads came in skeins, which were then wound on to thread holders. With the invention of the mercerisation process cotton thread

became stronger and more resistant to mildew. Before then the cotton was pulled through wax to improve the tensile quality. Wooden cotton reels replaced the refillable reels. The wooden reel was so cheap that it became disposable.

Pins were often made by prisoners and with the advent of pins came the need for pincushions. As pins were very expensive, pincushions were often given as wedding or christening presents. A stiletto was kept to help divide threads or pricking out patterns. A retractable tape measure, often made in fun shapes, along with a thimble was a further essential.

Many expressions have come from the manufacture of needle work items, such as "pin money", "happy hour" and "knocking off time".

This was a very interesting insight into the history of needlecraft items.

The competition was well supports with items beginning with "W" including an autumn wreath, wings from a WW2 airman's uniform, photos of windmills and a miniature bottle of whisky (purely for medicinal use!). Lynn's entry of a decorated trainer will go through to next month's Group Competition.

Also any and all ideas are welcome - to increase our visitor numbers, to become more visible, to celebrate our very existence.




The Memorial Hall was built by WH Bourne & Sons, builders in Woodchurch, in memory of those who lost their lives in WW1 & WW2.
