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
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

1.0- Distribution of responses within Woodchurch Parish














3.8- If you use the public transport how is the service frequency



5.19- Are you aware of the Woodchurch HUB and the services it offers





Bethersden Road has no pavement

Blind and disability access

Definitely not!! The pavements, especially along Lower Road on the opposite side to the Jean Mealham Centre - approaching the lower end of the Green are far too narrow. The regularly speeding vehicles + large speeding vehicles (often recklessly and excessively breaking the speed limit and lacking control) compounded with inadequate footpaths make walking along this route perilous and extremely stressful. It is a main + regular route for children and parents on the way to school + The Green, often with buggies, scooters + bikes, they are in great danger of losing their lives! This has been reported many times + nothing has been done!

Del/vans, 4x4, parked vehicles on pavements when you have to walk in the road with fast moving traffic.

Despite the very dubious speeding reports from the council, drivers travel too fast for the conditions and often drive with wheels on the footway to avoid parked vehicles. Traffic calming methods should be put in place to slow traffic,

Difficult if cars parked on pavement

Almost - We were nearly flooded when the drains were blocked by a plain of wood and the drainage system was poorly maintained. We were unable to use toilets and sinks etc for days on end prior to this problem being resolved (We had to use public conveniences on the Green in the middle of the night in Winter.)

Although we have not as yet actually flooded, being the lowest point of the village and backing on to the stream we are experiencing much higher water levels. It is only a matter of time before we do in fact have issues with flooding

Annexe and extension of memorial hall since new building concreted over previous drainage

As road drains are not kept clear, surface water is becoming an issue.,

Flooding around the treatment plant at bottom of village

Flooding on the track next to my home. Nothing has been done since reported many many years ago.....

Front Road has continually flooded from driveway to Nos 31-37a to end of village garage frontage. It may improve following extensive repairs during 2022/23!!

In heavy rain we have flooding around our property. We have sorted it ourselves because Wylderest dont give a damn

Internal foul water flood due to mains sewer blockage (December 2022), forcing our property to be vacated for six months to facilitate drying, decontamination and rehabilitation.

Sewage from main drain at junction Lower Rd and Front Rd has flooded my property twice. This will get worse when new properties are added to the system. My house insurance has increased due rto claims. If this happens again we will have to try sell our home and move from the village we both love.

Sewage rising in my drain during heavy rainfall

Surface water enters the sewer causing over capacity.

Living in constant fear of flooding - neighbours actually flooded

Since resurfacing rain water does not flow along the curb into the road gully but onto my drive

Site owners refuse to put in proper road drainage to take water to main drains.

Some surface water

Southern Water have partially fixed problem in this part of Lower Road (so no river every time it rains) but still a problem in heave rain. Husband says NOT fixed. 3 drains still totally blocked - 1 on corner of Green and 2 outside No 8 and 10

Surface flooding and overflowing drains are a big problem in Woodchurch, recent rain has seen huge puddles of water on the roads and drains overflowing. It does seem to be an issue in the village whenever there is moderate to heavy rain and a noticeable issue that requires attention.

Surface water flooding due to high water table and poorly draining soil

Surface water running down stret & amp; amp; collecting in some gardens

Surface water.

The ditches surrounding our property are dredged or cleared regularly enough. Water runs on to our property on a regular baais

This has been a continual and on-going issue both with surface water - all drains from upper road and across green lead into our property and more recently with sewage. We have undertaken comprehensive works ourselves but the volume of water is too great for the drains to deal with and we are regularly flooded in the garden. I have contacted Southern water and they have little interest in dealing with a proper solution - taking the public drainage onto public land. We are left with regular flooding and fear that this will not be addressed and further exacerbated by development as any loss of absorption results in greater surface water run off and developments 'plumbing in' to a system that can not cope with the present volumes of water.

We have also had problems twice in the last 6 months, of sewage leaking all over the garden and backing up. This is also, I was told by a Southern Water engineer, because Woodchurch can not deal with the present number of houses on the original old sewer line in times of rain.

Waste drainage backup which comes out of our manhole cover. Access surface water from the critical water course coming into our garden. This has worstened over the past 8-10 years.

We have to have a non-return valve installed in the downstairs toilet, so sewage doesn't come in when there is heavy rain


We live on the Green and we have surface water issues a lot - almost all of it from other parts of the village. We have had to invest significant sums to stop our garden flooding which is frustrating as none of the water is from our land but comes from elsewhere. We have improved the gully to the front of our house by putting a pipe in. This is an issue that really needs to be resolved by the Council as it is getting worse as the climate worsens.

9.2- Do you think that the police work well with the local community to identify and address local crime and disorder issues





9.3- What is your perception of crime in Woodchurch compared to 5 years ago





9.4- Does your road have a registered Neighbourhood Watch scheme





Higher police profile - more visibility

As a household we pay more than £300 per year as a contribution to policing. Taken as a whole for Woodchurch parish we should be able to employ and equip a full time police officer dedicated to specifically the parish. Do we get good value for this contribution?

I have seen the result of criminal damage on village green - broken benches etc.

I thought a test in a free box might be helpful too!

I would be reassuring to see a policeman/woman walking around the village at poignant times (eg rush hour periods, eventimes and busy times such as school entrance/exit times.

I wouldn't be against CCTV in the village car park, not sure about CCTV covering the green, it's a community space and not sure having CCTV there would be a good thing (i.e. could feel like an invasion of people's right to enjoy the open green space without feeling 'watched'. An occasional police presence in the village would be welcome, perhaps a drop-in at The Hub on a monthly basis so residents could report minor things that are bothering them, community police team to walk around the village from time to time to get to know residents (everyone so friendly here, an officer walking around might be able gather useful intel from residents in passing about issues concerning them)

I'm concerned about the recent increase in vandalism of public, commercial and private properties. There needs to be a laser focus on addressing this issue.

Involve young people in local projects from the Primary School

Prevention is better than cure

Provision of activities for likely perpetraters, devil makes work for idle hands

Publicised clear pathways for reporting both serious and low level antisocial behaviour





Windmill - I know that the windmill belongs to the Borough Council but it might be helpful if the Parish Council had some influence over the surrounding area. The litter bin is old, unsightly, leans towards the SW. It is generally full of fast food litter, dog poo bags, beer cans etc. ths spoiling an attractive area. It is seldom emptied (once this year?). It would be worth removng it, putting up a notice asking people to take their litter home and not spoil the beautiful view. (If they can carry it in, they cn carry it out!)

Yes, we were told by a Local Councillor, Parish Councillors and an Ashford Borough Councillor that traffic monitoring would take place along Lower Road following our concerns and complaint 2 years ago and to my knowledge this still has not taken place. I feel extremely strongly that this matter needs to be taken very seriously and dealt with as a matter of absolute urgency prior to a serious accident occurring. We are told regularly that you have to and wait for 'something' to happen before anything can be done, but I'm afraid I find this totally unacceptable!





Again I don't really see any.

Although some improvements have been made to roads, there is still a big problem with potholes (e.g. by The Green crossroads at The Green/Lower Road/Place Lane

Throughout the county (including Woodchurch parish) there appears to be excessive zeal in trimming grass verges on roads but NO attention to trimming vegetation obscuring road signs - with serious implications for road safety.

At times seem to have little regard for integrity of village - eg housing - their recommendations seem to be 'tick-box' exercises.

Close it down. Westminster should act straight to Parish Councils. Too many cooks spoil the broth.

Condition of roads is poor and poor quality of workmanship and very slow response

It would be useful for the Parish Council to publish how ABC and KCC actually do support Woodchurch. Our council tax contributions are the same as other communities but I could not identify a single element where Woodchurch has benefitted (other than road surfacing)

K.C.C. needs to work in conjunction with both Ashford Borough Council and the Parish Council in order to resolve the speeding traffic problems and inadequate pavements within the village as aforementioned at 6.6, 6.7, 11.10 and 11.13. This issue needs to be prioritised as a matter of urgency.

KCC appear to be slow in rehabilitating potholes and verges. Their programme should be more transparent. KCC Highways (road drainage) should consider taking a leading role in efficiently working with the Environmental Agency (open drains, streams and rivers) and Southern Water (sewerage management and treated discharge) to achieve an effective flood management system. At the moment one organisation appears to blame the other for the local floods!

KCC has no interest in anything apart from petty politics

KCC needs to do more in supporting our case for Southern Water to remedy the sewage/flooding in the lower village

KCC Highways is generally unsympathetic to the village views when considering Planning Applications. To say the speed limit is 30mph is a non-solution when dangerous areas are highlighted

KCCs support seems to be nil - far too busy closing M20 and making roads impassable.

Know your audience and support as appropriate. Rural location - poor transport links. Lots of social groups that are not easy to get to without support from neighbours and family can be very isolating.
